**Anglican Communion Cycle of Prayer:** *Pray for The Anglican Church in Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia and The Anglican Church of Australia.* 

We pray for Michael and Jan Gott (Evangelists) and Viktoria Korniychuk (Trainee nurse from the Ukraine).

As 'People of Hope,' we remember those impacted by natural disasters; those in Ukraine suffering grievously along with the people & leaders of Russia; and for a lasting peace for the people of Palestine, Israel and the wider Middle East.

**Lichfield Diocese:** Stir-up Sunday is the traditional day, the last Sunday before Advent (November 23<sup>rd</sup>), for families to gather and make Christmas pudding or cake by mixing all the ingredients and making a wish as they stir. The vintage collect: Stir up, we beseech thee, O Lord, the wills of thy faithful people; that they, plenteously bringing forth the fruit of good works, may of thee be plenteously rewarded; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

We pray on 24<sup>th</sup> for the meeting with the Assessors of Lichfield Archdeaconry, for each of the churches affected in the deaneries of Lichfield, Penkridge, Rugeley and Tamworth; for constructive discussions to be held and positive ways forward to be found. We pray for Lichfield's Archdeacon Sue, and a return to full health soon, and for the wider team in Lichfield Archdeaconry.

On 25<sup>th</sup> we pray for the online session of bite-size training on <u>Dementia-Friendly</u> <u>Church</u>, for a helpful time enabling and encouraging more churches towards this invaluable ministry.

On Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> we remember 'the first called' in the Apostle Andrew, Patron Saint of Scotland, and on Advent Sunday we start to look towards when you came to earth to live amongst us, and we can only thank you again that you came here to give each of us the opportunity to follow you, just like Andrew.

On Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> we pray for <u>'Introduction to Inclusive, Invitational and Inspiring Collective Worship'</u> from the Education Team. For all those attending, we pray they may leave inspired by the privilege and opportunity of leading worship in our schools, and that so many of our children and young people may ultimately benefit from it.

#### **REDUNDANT SPECTACLES FOR AFRICA**

Message from Dr Trevor James: So far this calendar year, over 1,700 pairs of redundant spectacles have been dispatched to Africa through the Direct Rotary collection locally. The support that is being offered means that statistically we are well ahead of this time last year. Half of what is being dispatched comes from two Lichfield opticians, but the rest is being collected from at least seven church collecting points from St Michael-on-the-Greenhill to King's Bromley to Weeford and Stonnall. Thank you for your continued support: we will be continuing the collection in 2026. We are making a measurable difference.

Note: Weeford church congregation have collected 27 pairs of redundant spectacles for the appeal. They will be part of the next dispatch in two weeks' time and so should be in West Africa before Christmas.
