Safeguarding —at the heart of our church life

Safeguarding is more than just a policy or a set of procedures—it is a core part of who we are as a church community. At St Leonard's, we believe that every person who walks through our doors should feel safe, valued, and protected. That is why safeguarding matters so deeply to us.

At its heart, safeguarding is about creating spaces where people can flourish without fear. It means being attentive to the needs of children, young people, and adults who may be vulnerable. It means ensuring that our leaders and volunteers are well trained and equipped. And it means committing ourselves to a culture where concerns can be raised openly, sensitively, and without hesitation.

Good safeguarding practice is an expression of our Christian faith.

Throughout the Bible, God calls His people to defend the powerless, to care for the vulnerable, and to treat every individual with dignity. Jesus himself makes it clear that anyone who welcomes a child in his name welcomes him. In safeguarding, we put those values into action. In practical terms, safeguarding helps us:

- Recognise risks and respond quickly when concerns arise
- Support survivors of abuse with compassion and respect
- Ensure volunteers and leaders are safely recruited and appropriately trained
- Build a culture of transparency, where every voice can be heard
- Protect children and adults so they can participate fully in church life

But safeguarding is not only about protection—it is also about confidence. When people know that their church takes safeguarding seriously, they feel safer to worship, to volunteer, to bring their families, and to become part of the community.

As a parish, we are grateful to everyone who helps us maintain high standards of care. Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility—not because we expect problems, but because we want to ensure that St Leonard's remains a place where God's love is lived out in practical, protective, and life-giving ways.

You may be aware that over the past few months we have been trying to recruit a new Parish Safeguarding Officer and we hope to make an exciting announcement concerning the role after the next PCC meeting.

Together, by caring for one another, we help St Leonard's continue to be a safe, welcoming, and vibrant community for all.

St Leonard's to join the Leading Your Church into Growth journey

We're delighted to share that the PCC has agreed that St Leonard's will join the Leading Your Church into Growth (LYCiG) programme in January 2026. This is an exciting and hopeful step for us as a church as we continue discerning how God is calling us to grow—in faith, in confidence, and in our life together.

This opportunity comes through the Diocesan Renewal Programme, a major initiative supported by a new national grant that aims to help parishes across the diocese revitalise their mission. Over the next few years, most churches in the Diocese of Blackburn will take part, with support from a dedicated team.

What this means for us

In January, a small team from St Leonard's will attend the LYCiG conference: a practical, inspiring time to explore how churches can grow warmer in fellowship, deeper in discipleship, and more confident in sharing their faith. After the conference, we'll receive ongoing support as we gently and prayerfully begin to put ideas into practice. This fits perfectly with the hopes we identified at our recent PCC Away Day—especially our desire to be a welcoming, inclusive, outward-looking church family, rooted in prayer and open to the Holy Spirit's leading.

Looking ahead to 2026

The Bishop has also invited every parish to host a mission event during the diocesan centenary year. Many churches in the renewal programme have found these events a powerful way of connecting with people who would not normally come to church. Over the coming months, we'll begin imagining what this might look like for us—something joyful, hospitable, and very "St Leonard's."

A journey we take together

This isn't simply a programme to complete—it's a journey of renewal for the whole church. It's about rediscovering hope, encouraging one another, and becoming more confident in the good news we share.

So as we begin this new chapter, we simply ask for your prayers:

- Pray for discernment in recruiting a LYCiG team.
- Pray for St Leonard's as we listen for God's guidance.
- Pray for the courage to grow, even in small and gentle steps.

We believe God has good things in store for us. Thank you for being part of this next stage of our life together.


