Safeguarding at St James the Great, Manston

At St James the Great, Manston, safeguarding is at the very heart of who we are as a church family. We believe that every person — regardless of age, gender, background, or circumstance — should feel safe, valued, and respected when they come through our doors. Creating a safe and welcoming environment is central to our calling to follow Jesus and to love one another as He loves us.

Our parish follows the **House of Bishops' Safeguarding Policy** set by the **Church of England**, which provides clear guidance to ensure that all our ministries and activities are carried out with the highest standards of care and accountability. This policy underpins everything we do, from our worship and community events to our work with children, young people, and vulnerable adults.

We are deeply committed to putting these principles into action. **Reverend Daniel Miles** and **Barbara Dunkley** serve as our **Parish Safeguarding Officers**, offering support, advice, and oversight in all safeguarding matters. They ensure that any concerns are handled promptly, sensitively, and in accordance with national and diocesan procedures.

Alongside this, Caroline Wainwright is our Health and Safety Co-ordinator, ensuring that our church buildings and activities are managed safely for everyone who visits or takes part in church life.

All our **policies and risk assessments** are available to view at the **back of church**, so that everyone can see the standards we uphold and the care we take.

Safeguarding is not just a policy — it reflects our faith in action. At St James the Great, we are committed to being a place where the love of Christ is shown through respect, safety, and care for every individual.

St James the Great, Manston – Our Financial Needs for the Remainder of 2025 and for 2026

As we approach the final months of 2025, we want to take a moment to thank everyone who has supported the life and ministry of **St James the Great, Manston** throughout this year. Your generosity—through giving, fundraising, and volunteering—has enabled us to maintain our worship, pastoral care, and community outreach in so many meaningful ways.

At the end of September, our **year-to-date balance stood at -£98**, which is remarkably stable and a testament to the ongoing commitment of our congregation. We are, overall, in a **comfortable financial position**. However, as we enter the colder months, our **utility costs inevitably rise** as we heat both the church and the hall for services, gatherings, and community activities. Our goal is to finish the year **at or close to a zero balance**, as we have successfully managed to do in the past two years.

We are deeply grateful to all who give regularly or contribute when they can—it truly makes a difference. As we look to the rest of 2025, we ask everyone to **review their financial giving** and consider whether they can maintain, increase, or adjust their contributions as their circumstances allow. Every pound given helps us sustain our ministry and our mission to serve the community.

If you are **not currently part of our regular giving scheme**, we warmly invite you to consider joining. Regular giving—no matter how small—helps us to plan ahead with confidence. For example, if each of the **100 people on our electoral roll** were to donate £1 per week for a full year, we would raise £5,200. If half of that amount were gift aided, we could reclaim an additional £728 from HMRC, bringing the total to £5,928. This would cover around half of our annual utility costs—a significant contribution towards keeping our church warm and welcoming throughout the year.

Our parish share for 2025 is £53,665, and by year end we expect to have paid approximately 80% of that amount. The parish share for 2026 has now been set at £54,156, representing an increase of less than 1%. In our Vision Document, we set a target to increase our payment to 85% of the share in 2026, which would total £46,032—an increase of around £300 on this year's payment.

This is an achievable and important goal, and with the continued generosity and faithfulness of our congregation, we are confident that we can meet it. We will share more detailed information about our **2026 budget** and the **parish share** early in the new year.

Thank you once again for all that you give—financially, practically, and prayerfully. Together, we can ensure that St James the Great remains a **thriving**, welcoming, and sustainable **church** at the heart of Manston.


