#### **Advent Calendar**

#### Rev'd Matthew writes:

I love Christmas, and I love Advent too! Advent helps us to explore the depth of what we celebrate at Christmas. Tinsel and carols alone could ring a bit hollow. Christmas brings great 'comfort and joy' but the birth of Jesus has a strangeness about it too. A poem that explores this theme, and will be read at our Advent Carol service on 30<sup>th</sup> November at St. Clement, is called Advent Calendar by Rowan Williams.

Like a good friend, it's worth spending some time with this poem. It has some beautiful images which speak to us about the ways Jesus comes to us. In the first three stanzas Jesus comes silently: 'like last leaf's fall', 'like frost' and 'like dark', but then, in the last stanza, he comes 'like crying in the night'. Jesus's birth is not neat and tidy (or cosy), just as our world is not neat and tidy (or cosy). The birth of Jesus includes blood, sweat and tears - as does
