Parish Finances – A Simple Update

Our weekly running costs remain higher than our weekly income.

Weekly running cost: £2,231 Weekly income: £1,975

Weekly shortfall: £256 This shortfall is currently being met from General Fund

reserves. Lucy has confirmed that:

- The General Account (running costs) will be depleted by July/August 2026.
- The Reserves Account (supporting Parish Share) will also be significantly reduced. This situation requires prayerful attention and practical support.

How We Can Help Reverse This Trend. One immediate way to increase income is to strengthen the hire of the Pilgrim Centre, which offers:

- Attic Floor hire available 7 davs a week
- Ground Floor hire available 6 days a week It is entirely achievable to raise an additional £10,000 per year through effective promotion. We need a small volunteer team to work with

Fr James, the Churchwarden, and the PCC on:

- promoting the Pilgrim Centre
- managing enquiries

- supporting bookings
- raising its profile in the community

A committed group will have a real and lasting impact.

The First Sunday of Advent: Prophets, Hope, and the First Candle.

The First Sunday of Advent opens the Church's year with a call to watchfulness and hope. We listen once more to the **Prophets**, those fearless voices who spoke God's promise into seasons of darkness and exile. Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Baruch proclaimed that God had not forgotten His people: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light." Their witness teaches us that Christian hope rests not on optimism, but on God's unfailing faithfulness.

Today we light the first Advent candle, the Candle of Hope. Its single flame symbolises the light of God breaking into human darkness, the beginning of a promise unfolding, and the certainty that even a small light can guide a weary people home. It recalls the prophets' longing for the Messiah and the Church's own longing for Christ's return. Advent holds together humility of Bethlehem and the majesty of the Second Coming. In the Blessed Sacrament, the promised Saviour draws near, strengthening us to wait with confidence, courage, and hope.
