Today's readings are Matthew 25: 34-40 and Micah 4: 1-5

#### Clive writes....

The poppies float down from the top of the Albert Hall onto the heads of Service men and women, wreaths are laid on War Memorials large and small, up and down the country and the Last Post and Reveille sound – it's Remembrance Day again as it has been every year since 1919. Where do your thoughts go during the Two Minutes Silence? Perhaps to a long lost relative or a more recent bereavement resulting from conflict, perhaps to somebody permanently damaged in body or mind in defence of our way of life.

Two minutes out of a year doesn't seem much in return for their sacrifice, what else can we do? We have to face it there is very little we can do as individuals to prevent wars, if there was, I'm sure we would have done it by now. Wars between states or, in some ways worse, civil wars, seem always with us. Some are at the forefront of our minds, that in Ukraine for example, others we hear little about, the situation in Sudan is beyond terrible. We are left with feelings of inadequacy.

If we can't have an impact on the big things, there is nothing to stop us doing the little things that can make life better for others. One of the readings we are using in today's services is from Matthew's Gospel (Chapter 25 verses 34 to 40), why not read it for yourself? In it there are several suggestions as to how we can help make the world a better place, one person at a time, that surely is manageable. Simple things like giving a thirsty stranger a drink, visiting someone who is ill or in prison or just making a stranger feel welcome. Their little part of the world will seem a bit better as indeed will ours. World Peace will not be the result but in the words of the old saying, look after the pennies and the pounds will look after themselves which we could translate as look after the little things and the big things might also improve.

# Reading the Bible

An alternative would be to obtain a copy of 'Reflections for Daily Prayer' which is published by Church House Publishing. This indicates readings for every day of the year from the Church of England lectionary with a reflection upon the reading. This can be obtained from Amazon or Church House Bookshop online.
