FIRST READING Isaiah 2:1-5

A reading from the Prophet Isaiah.

The word that Isaiah the son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem.

It shall come to pass in the latter days that the mountain of the house of the LORD shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be lifted up above the hills; and all the nations shall flow to it, and many peoples shall come, and say:

'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths.'
For out of Sion shall go forth the law, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem.
He shall judge between the nations, and shall decide disputes for many peoples; and they shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more.

So then let us cast off the works of darkness and put on the armour of light. Let us walk properly as in the daytime, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and sensuality, not in quarrelling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ.

GOSPEL Matthew 24:37-44

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew.

At that time: Jesus said to his disciples: 'For as were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, and they were unaware until the flood came and swept them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two men will be in the field; one will be taken and one left. Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken and one left. Therefore, stay awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But know this, that if the master of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'

The Parish of St Anselm, Hayes

November 30th, 2025 Advent Sunday

Once again we enter that period of penitence, reflection, and anticipation that we call Advent. We need constantly to be ready — "for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect." In the gospel reading today, Jesus emphasises first the simple unexpectedness of events. When the flood came in Noah's time, everyone was living just as they always did. We will be doing exactly the same when Jesus



returns in glory. Jesus then emphasises a different point. Although everyone will be equally taken unawares, and everyone

might look the same from the outside, some will be ready whilst others will not be. How can we be ready for something when we do not know that it's about to happen? The only way to be ready for Jesus's second coming is to live *every* moment as if he is coming *immediately*. As if we have *only* the present moment left in our lives. That's hard to do, but we should all try not to waste a single moment of our God-given time on earth.

In Advent we do not sing the Gloria and we have two collects – the first of the day, on the other side of this sheet, followed by the traditional Advent Collect:

Almighty God, give us grace that we may cast away the works of darkness, and put upon us the armour of light, now in the time of this mortal life, in which your Son Jesus Christ came to visit us in great humility; that in the last day when he shall come again in his glorious majesty, to judge both the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, now and for ever. Amen.
