"Good to hear from you, here is what I want you to do for me because I'm a little busy right now, conflicting priorities, I'm only available here for now. I have been working on incentives and I aimed at surprising some of our diligent staff with gift cards this week. This should be confidential until they all have the gift cards as it's a surprise. Can you get this done remotely and how soon?

Please be extra vigilant and don't respond to emails like these!

## Messy Church needs your help!



#### **OXON CHURCH** "DEMENTIA FRIENDLY CHURCH" TRAINING 8 NOVEMBER 2025 10-12:30



Where are we encountering dementia in our church/community? What are our experiences of dementia? Dementia is part of every community -

and across all age groups 50% of people fear dementia more than any other health condition, according to a recent survey. So, as people of faith, believing that perfect love casts out fear, it's important that we name and face dementia together

Dementia affects many people. It brings very real challenges and changes over time. As dementia progresses, patterns of life change not just for the person with dementia but for those around them, their family and their church or community too. Many of us have direct experience of dementia ourselves, perhaps with a partner or a parent, a friend or a neighbour

Our Dementia-Friendly Churches network supports churches in becoming more dementiafriendly churches at the heart of dementia-friendly communities. Across the Diocese of Lichfield, many churches are taking action on dementia are part of this network. More than 100 churches are involved - and, whether or not you are already involved, this session is a good opportunity for churches to come together in increasing understanding and taking next steps.

Sarah Thorpe, our Diocese of Lichfield Dementia-Friendly Church Enabler, is going to run a Dementia-Friendly Church Training session at Oxon Church, Welshpool Road, Bicton Heath, Shrewsbury, SY3 5AH. ## Things to avoid saying to somebody with dementia

## 5. Open questions can be hard: 'What did you do this morning?'

Avoid asking too many open-ended questions about the past, as it could be stressful for a person with dementia if they can't remember the answer. While it might seem polite to ask somebody about their day, it's better to focus on what's happening in the present.

## Try this instead:

Instead of asking them about their day, speak briefly about your day and give them time to ask you questions about it.

They might then offer information about what they have done. Talk to them about the present and use items in the environment such as photos or ornaments to stimulate conversation.

# Installation of the 106th Archbishop of Canterbury

The Installation of the 106th Archbishop of Canterbury, Sarah Mullally, will take place at Canterbury Cathedral on Wednesday 25 March 2026, the Feast of the Annunciation.

Historically known as an enthronement, the Installation marks the symbolic start of the Archbishop of Canterbury's public ministry in the Church of England and across the Anglican Communion.

Rooted in centuries of tradition, the service will look forward with the hope of Jesus Christ - and celebrate the diversity of the Church of England, the nation and the Anglican Communion today.



Archbishop Sarah will be installed on the Cathedral Chair (Cathedra) as the Diocesan Bishop of the See of Canterbury, the oldest diocese in the English church. Following this, she will be installed on the Chair of St Augustine (St Augustine Cathedra) as Primate of All England, which also symbolises her ministry in the Anglican Communion.

The Feast of the Annunciation celebrates the day the Angel Gabriel told Mary she would be the mother of Jesus.

Details about the Installation service will be shared in the lead up to the service.

Bishop Sarah remains Bishop of London until her Confirmation of Election at St Paul's Cathedral on 28 January 2026, at which she will legally become the Archbishop of Canterbury.

Until then, as well as preparing to begin her ministry as Archbishop, Bishop Sarah is fulfilling her remaining commitments as Bishop of London.

#### Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> November: (Commemoration of the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day))

We commence a series of prayers for Uttoxeter deanery by lifting before you all of our church schools there. We pray for the two All Saints schools in both Church Leigh and Denstone and for the two St Peter's in both Alton and Marchington. We pray for Dove and Ryecroft schools in Rocester and for Hutchinson Memorial in Checkley. In Uttoxeter itself we pray for three schools, St Mary's, Tynsel Parkes, and Windsor Park. May your hand rest upon the staff and volunteers who work in each of these schools in whatever role; and for all the children and their families who are part of them.

Monday 3<sup>rd</sup>: (Richard Hooker, Priest, Anglican Apologist, Teacher of the Faith, 1600. Martin of Porres, Friar, 1639)
Dear Lord, on St Winifrede's Day we pray for Shrewsbury Abbey, where her remains reside, and so too their sister church of St Peter's Monkmoor. Lord, we humbly ask for your wisdom and guidance for two different meetings as they take place this morning. We pray for the Shrewsbury Area Mission and Pastoral Committee, and for the Trusts Projects, Loans and Grants Team. Lord, please with all those involved in these meetings, both involved behind the scenes, or affected by the decisions they take; please guide those decisions to further your mission in this place.

We pray for the churches that are directly affected and thank you for all those people leading and serving in them; for each of those churches in Croxden, Denstone, Hollington, Kingstone, Leigh, Marchington, and Rocester.

#### Saturday 8th: (The Saints and Martyrs of England)

Today we pray for different events taking place in Shropshire. We pray for the <u>Study Day on the Gospel of Matthew</u> taking place at Telford Minster, please bless and guide the Speaker Dave Allen so that all those who come may discover more about the gospel - and more about the person that it's about.
