### Cassa to become Archdeacon of Buckingham



The next Archdeacon of Buckingham will be the Revd Cassa Messervy. Cassa is currently the rector of our benefice - Wychert Vale — and is based in Haddenham. She has been with us since 2021 and has spent all her time in the diocese since she was ordained in 2011. She served her curacy in Beaconsfield, before moving to Seer Green and Jordans, and then to Wychert Vale. She takes up her new role in March next year.

She said: "I was surprised and delighted by my call to this role! It has been a joy to serve in the Wychert Vale Benefice and to see God at work here. I am looking forward to seeing all that God is doing in our deaneries and working with and for the wonderful people of the Buckingham Archdeaconry."

#### The Day and Hour Unknown

<sup>36</sup> "But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son but only the Father. <sup>37</sup> As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. <sup>38</sup> For in the days before the flood, people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day Noah entered the ark; <sup>39</sup> and they knew nothing about what would happen until the flood came and took them all away.
