Reflection for November

I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. (John 13:34)

Dear Friends,

The four Sundays in November leading up to Advent Sunday (on 30 November) are sometimes referred to collectively as "Kingdom Season".

The Kingdom of God was definitely one of Jesus' favourite subjects. One writer has drily observed that Jesus came proclaiming the Kingdom of God, and what he got was the Church!

But what is the Kingdom of God?

It's certainly more than the afterlife; and not just "pie in the sky when you die". One way of describing it might be to think of it as what the world would be like if God were king instead of our rulers and politicians.

Jesus taught us to pray:

"Your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

The Kingdom of God appears wherever God's will is done on earth as it is in heaven: wherever justice and fairness prevail; wherever hungry mouths are fed; wherever the homeless are housed; wherever reconciliation replaces conflict; wherever love wins out over hatred and revenge.

We, as Church, are called by Jesus to be a living, breathing demonstration of the Kingdom of God; to be a place of unconditional acceptance, of equal opportunity; a place where diversity is celebrated, where anyone and everyone can be at home in the love of God.

This "Kingdom Season", let's make Church a verb, rather than a noun – an event, a happening an experience, not an institution or a religious club.

"Your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

Amen.
