Busy – but spend time with God!

I started this week at St Mary's for the Monday 8.30am morning prayer service. If you haven't been, and are free at that time, it's a great way to commit your week to God. Just 30 minutes of reading the bible and praying together, in the peace and beauty of St Mary's.

You will be aware that Christmas is coming. A chance to remember that God came to Earth to enable us to enter heaven. A great time to praise God, to easily invite people to events to hear the good news of Jesus (do see our services and events list) and also a time to spend with family and friends. It's all good. But then I looked at my diary. I use google calendar and my events are coloured green on my screen. There is a lot of green in the coming weeks. Christmas is great but also means extra activities and events.

And then in our prayer time on Monday we read psalm 46. It's a great reminder that whatever is going on, God is constant. The nations may be in uproar, but God is with us. The God of Jacob is our refuge.

So, my tip for glancing at an ever-filling diary and not being overwhelmed is to spend time with God. To remember that whatever comes, he is there. I've said before that advent and Christmas are a time of clergy hypocrisy where we speak of being calm and seeking God and then rush to the next school event or service. But without the time to refuel, to simply 'be' in God's presence, our work is for nothing. This is a message for me, as much as one to share.

May your Christmas preparation be peaceful, your advent God filled, and may you know the presence of the God who doesn't change; however much green appears on your calendar.


Sunday morning 'Zoom' Coffee invitation

Martlesham and Brightwell – Parish Giving Scheme

Brightwell PCC has recently joined the Parish Giving Scheme. Martlesham has been a member for a number of years.

Instead of giving in cash at one of our churches or setting up a standing order with your bank you can set up a regular payment by direct debit, via the Parish Giving Scheme. This is normally collected at the beginning of each month. Each year PGS will contact you to see if you are happy for your gift to be increased in line with inflation — and you have the choice to review your giving and change it, if you want to. If you are a taxpayer, then the gift aid can be claimed and PGS do this directly from the government.

The advantage for each PCC is the giving and the tax is received regularly each month and without having to complete a Gift Aid tax claim. The same money given but a lot less work for the treasurer. If you would like to join the scheme you can setup a payment by either:

- 3. Filling in an application form available in each church and sending it to:


