LIVING IN LOVE AND FAITH OPEN LETTER

In October the House of Bishops made a series of key decisions on the future direction of the Church of England's Living in Love and Faith process, which explores questions of relationships, sexuality and marriage. Final decisions will be taken in December. Primarily these decisions mean that special 'bespoke' services using Prayers of Love and Faith (i.e.: same-sex blessings) are unlikely to be introduced and, whilst they can be civilly partnered, clergy would still not be able to enter into same-sex marriages.

As a result of these decisions Inclusive Church has written an open letter for individual members of the Church of England to sign. As St Mary's is a member of the Inclusive Church Network we are suggesting that you read the letter and decide whether or not you would like to sign it. Churches cannot sign it – rather it is a matter of individual conscience

and prayer. You can read more about Inclusive Church's thoughts and sign the letter by following the link below. There will also be print-outs of the letter in church which you can read, and if you would like help digitally signing then please speak to Donna.

If you do decide you wish to sign then the deadline is midnight on Sunday 23 November.

NOTES ON A GREEN THEME

Author Olivia Warburton has recently published a practical guide book called 'Dreaming of a Green Christmas.' Written for families to work through, she says that her little book is an essential companion to help you prepare for the festive season.

It includes 111 practical eco-tips to select from to inspire and encourage you as you ramp up to Christmas. Her view is that everyone can make a difference to help our world flourish,

however tiny our efforts may seem. Previously BRF Ministries' head of content creation and Living Faith ministry lead, she is an experienced writer, editor and communications specialist. The Tree

Did you know that it is possible to rent a Christmas tree which can be returned and replanted?

Alternatively you could buy a potted spruce with roots that can be planted out and nurtured for use through the years. Or buy a Grown in Britain or FSC-certified tree to ensure that it's from a well-managed forest and recycle it through the council's recycling system.

The carbon footprint of an artificial tree is significantly higher than for a real tree and it will end up in landfill but, if you already have one, keep it for as long as possible.
