It has been an enjoyable and successful year, with good attendance, and lots of activities and outings. We have several new members. Kathy Gemmell was re-elected as President.

It's hard saying farewell to good people but it's not goodbye. We will drop in and say hello, from time to time.

26 October

News travels fast of Dan's return home from Royal Manchester Children's Hospital after three years. Stefan Ortega, who is the goalkeeper for Dan's beloved Manchester City, sent him a personal message, wishing good luck on leaving hospital.

29 October

After three years of being in hospital, Dan is finally back home. The highs have been high, and the lows have been low. There have been many times when we have felt it was a totally impossible task, but with everyone's help to get Dan home, he is back home where he belongs.

Thank you to everyone who has supported our family and our Dan.

It's now time to start rebuilding our lives and get the rehabilitation and a quality of life for Dan. You will be able to follow Dan's next steps, going to school, living life and enjoying it. and of course, the long road to recovery.

If you still want to help and support Dan, we'll be deeply thankful. There is no question that he would benefit from additional rehabilitation, therapies and equipment not readily available on the NHS.

FRECKLETON HISTORY GROUP

Notes of Meeting of Freckleton History Group, in association with Freckleton Library, on 29 October 2025

Steve welcomed everyone and said that the updated graveyard inscriptions at the church were nearly finished, and he then introduced our Speaker, Steve Williams, who gave a talk on *Lancashire lasses*.

Steve talked a bit about his early life, that he was born in Kirkham and he was now living in Brindle, and then went on to introduce some famous and not so famous Lancashire lasses, telling us a little bit about each one:

- Lily Parr scored 900 goals for the Dick Kerr Ladies team (1917 1926).
- Emmeline Pankhurst a famous suffragette, and Kathleen Marshall, her personal bodyguard. Kathleen trained in ju-jitsu and was jailed numerous times for attacking 10 Downing Street.
- Bessie Braddock politician and Labour MP.
- Pat Seed journalist and cancer fundraiser, who raised £2m.
- Kathleen Tatlow headmistress, who was the headmistress at Steve's school.
- Jessica Lofthouse author and historian, who wrote over 20 books on Lancashire.
- Doreen Lofthouse of Fishermen's Friend fame, who left £41m to charity.
- The Nolans a Blackpool-based pop group.
- Ranvir Singh TV presenter, born in Preston and who went to Kirkham Grammar School.
- Lisa Goodwin-Allen chef, who now works at Northcote Manor.
- Victoria Wood entertainer, comedian, actress, writer, composer and singer.
- Thora Hird actress, born in Morecombe.
- **Hylda Baker** actress and entertainer, born in Farnworth.
- The Preston Buffer Volunteers at Preston Station in WW1 and WW2.
- Florrie Hughes shop manageress in ladies' underwear.
- **Ermyntrude De Trafford** WW2 nurse who worked at Moor Park Military Hospital in Preston.
- **Phoebe Mercer** WW2 nurse, a keen golfer, drowned at Bangkok (she was the only lady buried in Bangkok).
- Nellie Smith wartime worker from Euxton.
- Philomena Simmonds Lady De Hoghton. She was a typist who (at the age of 19) became a titled lady by marrying Sir Cuthbert De Hoghton.
- **Kathleen Ferrier** classical singer, born in Higher Walton and who worked as a GPO telephonist in Blackburn.

- Jane Preston postwoman, she worked for 47 years as a postwoman in Cockerham.
- Pit Girls working in the Lancashire coalfields, sorting coal by hand. Their last shift was in 1957.
- Mill Girls working in the Lancashire Cotton Mills, 1860s to 1970s.
- Sugar Girls working for Tate & Lyle in Liverpool.
- **Sister Francis** a nun from Chorley for 86 years. Her father died in WW1 and was a Chorley Pal. She unveiled the Chorley Pals Memorial in 2010; and finally...
- Gracie Fields singer and actress born in Rochdale.

Sally thanked Steve for his very informative talk. Who knew how many famous "lasses" came from Lancashire!

We arranged our next meeting for Wednesday 26 November at the library, with the new time of 14:00 for a 14:15 start, with David Hoyle to give a talk on *Myths of Lytham*.

The home is under new management and has had a recent Care Quality Commission Inspection with a rating of **GOOD** in all areas. The home provides high quality, short, respite and long-term care including day care with bathing service to older people.

The accommodation is provided over two floors, with a variety of daily living spaces for people and their guests to enjoy. Bedrooms are nicely furnished with TV points, a call system and sensor mats. People are encouraged to bring their own furniture to personalise their bedroom. There are communal garden and secure patio areas. People are encouraged to sit outdoors and enjoy the fresh air.

The home is close to local amenities such as chemist, churches – Methodist and Anglican, library, post office, pub, restaurant, shops, and two GP surgeries. There is a bus stop nearby which goes to Preston, Lytham and Blackpool. Food is freshly prepared at the home and people are offered a choice menu throughout the day. People are encouraged to spend quality time with relatives which includes having a freshly prepared meal together. Staff are trained to a high standard and provide person-centred care to people living at the home with dignity and respect.

People are encouraged to make choices and decisions with regard to daily living to promote empowerment and enhance their sense of wellbeing and fulfilment.

The home employs an activity care assistant who takes a personcentred approach to creating the weekly activity program. Regular consultations are held with people to discuss what they like to do in order for people to have positive outcomes and live their life the way they choose at the Old Vicarage.

The home operates an open-door policy, visitors are welcome to join in with planned events. People are welcome to come and view the home without an appointment.

We will remember them



As many of you will be aware, this autumn we have been appealing for support to rebuild the Life Christian School in India, which provides a quality Christian education to 200 children from rural communities.

The construction of the new school building is moving along smoothly. The foundations are finished, and all 27 foundation pillars are in place.





The next steps after this work will be to complete the land filling and start on the concrete slab that will form the first floor of the building.





We are pleased to share that the children's education is continuing without interruption in the temporary school. They recently celebrated the 79th Indian Independence Day. The students enjoyed an entertainment programme where they each took part in singing and dancing activities.

We shared in our last newsletter that we estimate the rebuilding of the school will cost approximately £66,000, with ongoing running costs of approximately £24,000 per year to cover the cost of teaching and afterschool provision.
