And finally...

Christmas and Oliver Cromwell: In June 1647, Parliament passed an ordinance banning Christmas, Easter and Whitsun festivities, services and celebrations, including festivities in the home. People caught observing the day with activities like exchanging gifts, feasting, dancing, or wearing fine clothes could be fined five shillings. In London, soldiers were ordered to patrol the streets on December 25th and forcibly seize any food (such as pies, goose, or capons) they discovered being prepared for Christmas celebrations, as the day was mandated as a time of fasting.
