Gallery Forty5

Gallery Forty5 in Felton is holding its final repair shop of the year on Saturday, December 20th. We are invited to bring along 'clothes, household fabrics, items that need sharpening, toys, ceramics, small pieces of furniture etc', to be given a second life.

A few seasonal Eco thoughts:

- Look out for 'good' wrapping paper which can be recycled (as opposed to the shiny type). There is a great selection in the Oxfam shop.
- Cards with glitter or shiny bits can't be recycled.
- Foil is so handy but unfortunately it is hard on the environment it uses a great deal of heat in the making, and the mining of the aluminium produces a product known as 'red mud' which poses an environmental hazard so use as sparingly as you can manage.
- Pop those left-overs in jars or lidded containers (or use a good old plate and saucer!) rather than cling film, which is plastic. (Environmentally friendly cling film and foil can be bought at 'World of Difference').
- 'Sellotape' have now made a plastic free version of their product and paper-based parcel tape is also on the market, both at Sainsbury's.
- It will be a while before we can return home with no plastic in our shopping bags, but in the meantime we can at least make sure all our 'soft' plastics (bread and frozen food bags etc) are returned to either Sainsbury's or the Co-op to be turned into new products! And of course, reuse the bags which we can't avoid buying for other things (once washed); frozen food bags, peas etc are particularly good for this. Keep a good supply of them handy. It is possible to buy rolls of plastic free bags on the internet.

It is getting a little easier to be a little greener and if we cheerfully do what we can God will multiply our 'offerings'.
