# Letter January 2026

Dear friends,  
Happy New Year!

As Christmas decorations find their way back into the loft (or wherever you store them for 11 months of the year), and 2025 diaries and calendars are moved and replaced with the 2026 versions , the whole year stretches out before us - like a pristine snowscape with no footprints. I wonder what lies ahead, what will be the celebrations and challenges, what dates will take on significance for us and what memories are waiting to be formed.

One of the things I like to consider from time to time is that God knows everything – whether past, present or future, nothing is hidden from him, rather he sees and knows it all. Some people might find that intimidating, but personally I find it comforting that God is in charge, that he has a plan and nothing is going to happen for which he exclaims “*Well there’s a*

*surprise – I didn’t see that coming!”*

Each year I choose a verse or verses from the bible for the year ahead which I believe God is holding before me and which I pray will act as a touchstone for us as a parish – something we can return to again and again and use to reconnect us to what God is wanting to do in our lives. You could call it a motto for the year. This year I’ve chosen some verses from my favourite Old Testament prophet, Isaiah. As you will see when you turn to page 5 these verses encourage us to look ahead and see what God is about to do, rather than look back at what he has already done.

An oasis of flourishing and fruitfulness is described in which wasteland and wilderness are transformed. And the reason given for this rebirth is that God’s people will praise him. These verses are also a good description of what happened during Epiphany - the church season that begins on 6th January. This is the time when we focus our thoughts on the

Magi, the mysterious travellers who journeyed from the East, following a star until it led them to the place where Jesus lay. They had to let go of everything they knew and all that had gone before in order to set out on their journey into the unknown. They journeyed through wastelands and wilderness, not really understanding what they were looking for, but convinced they had been called to step out in faith. It was only after they discovered Jesus that things made sense.

Sometimes God calls us to look forward and see the new thing he is doing, trusting that he will provide along the way and enable us to discover his purposes. My prayer for this New Year is that we will have the courage to step out in faith and embrace the future God has for us. And when we discover what it all means, I pray that we will not forget to bring him our praise and worship.

# Epiphany for Today



This month we celebrate Epiphany, the occasion on which we remember the Magi from the East following a star to find the baby Jesus: 'Where is the One who has been born king of the Jews?' (Matthew 2:1).

At the start of a New Year, in an uncertain world, we can be asking the same question. The gifts the Magi offered point us to how Jesus can answer our concerns and worries: 'they bowed down and worshipped Him...and presented Him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.' (2:11).

The gift of gold reflects that the Magi saw in the baby a king, destined to rule over us all. In this coming year we need to remember that Jesus is on the throne, the seat of power and authority in the whole universe.

Will we crown Him king of our lives and dedicate all that we are and do to Him?

The gift of frankincense reflects that the visitors saw not just an earthly king, but God in human flesh. Incense symbolises the prayers of God's people and so this gift reminds us that God is worthy of our worship and prayer. Will we offer our praise and prayer, as we seek God to guide us through the uncertainties of this coming year?

The gift of myrrh reflects that these astrologers saw beyond the baby's birth and life, to His death which would secure life for all. Jesus was offered myrrh on the cross and was a spice used in His tomb. As we face challenges in the future, we can be confident that Jesus knows and understands our experience. Are we ready to trust Him in everything?




## WISE MEN FROM THE EAST

# Recycling & Green Living Tips

## Happy New Year!



### New Year is a good time to make some resolutions

1. The UK throws out 13 billion plastic bottles a year. Try and reduce this by taking a re-usable bottle with you. If you must use a plastic bottle, make sure that you recycle it.

2. Wash smarter: cooler washes (e.g. 20C) save energy, preserve the fibres in clothes and makes them last longer. Use an eco-friendly detergent such as Ecover. The same applies to dishwashers: lower temperatures and eco-friendly dishwasher tablets. Only put the dishwasher on when it is fully loaded.

3. Repair, reuse, recycle will create less waste. Shop secondhand for clothes and other items. Phones, laptops, printers and game consoles can be repaired. Unusable devices must be recycled.

4. Own less and feel good. Ask yourself if you really need it—can it be bought secondhand?

### Avoid Coach handbags

If you need to buy a new handbag, avoid the Coach brand. They source their leather from cows illegally farmed on ranches in the Brazilian rainforests on indigenous peoples' land. This was reported by the Times in November last year.

### Top Ethical High Street Shops

Last autumn Ethical Consumer listed 5 high scoring mainstream brands to help us find more ethical options on the high street.

They listed a brand in five different categories:

- cosmetics, health and beauty
- clothing
- food/supermarkets
- general shop/pre-loved
- department store/white goods

### Health & Beauty

#### Lush

This company refuses to test on animals and supports campaign organisations and initiatives such as the Lush Prize, a yearly event that funds research to replace animal-testing. It tries to use only natural ingredients and has taken action to ensure that it does not use ingredients like mica that are linked to human rights abuses. They also minimise packaging with some of their shops only selling products that are packaging free.

Company ethical score: 70/100

## **Clothing**

**Patagonia** is a B-Corp, or 'Benefit Corporation'. This means that employees, communities and the environment are considered alongside shareholders in decision making processes. In September 2022, its owner donated the \$3 billion company to the climate – ensuring that all profits will go towards supporting climate action. The company has worked hard to change things in the high street clothing and outdoor gear world, where ethics are notoriously low. It champions more ethical down – meaning that feathers used in your jacket aren't from live plucking. It uses recycled plastic in most of its polyester fabric, including for its trademark fleeces. Company ethical Score: 64/100

## **Food/Supermarkets**

The Co-op now has food stores in most town centres and is a leader in supermarket ethics including for fair trade ingredients. The company is also owned by an active membership (rather than shareholders) and has a strong internal democracy. It has started publishing a yearly report and action plan called the "Co-operative Way". This sets out its latest commitments to a tackling several issues including climate change, loneliness and waste.

Company ethical Score: 52/100

## **Preloved/secondhand**

**Oxfam Shop** is a top ethical option in secondhand shops and is undoubtedly the most ethical option on the high street. Oxfam sells a wide range of pre-loved books, clothes, furniture and electronics in its shops. For new products that it sells, Oxfam makes sure that workers are treated fairly and scored 80/100 in the workers category in the rating system.

Company ethical Score: 90/100

## **John Lewis**

The John Lewis' Partnership's company structure makes it one of the more progressive shops on the high street. The Partnership is an employee-owned business with the workers sharing in company profits and having a say in how the business is run. It also scores well for tax policy. While its ethical score leaves a fair bit of room for improvement, it does outrank many of the other high street alternatives, included in Ethical Consumer's supermarkets guide, with its Waitrose brand. It also sells some of the recommended brands in their electrical appliances guides.

Company ethical Score: 44/100

Try and use these shops when you can instead of alternatives.



Welcome to new members Mathew and Karen working alongside Pat & Jane


