## News from St. Mary's

Writing these notes is rather like writing a report on a football match at half-time; play in the first half has been full of interest, but it is the result at the end that is most important.

Much has happened here since the last Church Life Matters. For our quiz to support the work of Medecins sans Frontieres in Gaza, we had a full house and raised £426. The attendance at our monthly Coffee Morning was lower than usual, but we did not suffer financially. This was largely due to two factors: firstly, the wide range of cakes and pastries baked by Annette and Sarah and secondly by a rather bizarre raffle, where, due to the large number of prizes, everybody who had bought a ticket was sure to receive at least one and we raised £139 on the day.

The afternoon Christingle service is proving popular with children from both the primary and pre-school being present. This guaranteed a large number of parents, grandparents and carers being there. Numbers meant that the children bearing candles could not process around the church, but, fortunately, our team of firewatchers was not brought into action. There was a collection for the work of The Children's Society which raised £133.

Apart from the carols, there were certain similarities between the Beer & Carols and our Carol Service in the church the following Sunday. Both of them attracted approximately fifty people and on both occasions, we were pleased to welcome a number of people not known for being church goers. We must thank Jane Butler, who provided the music in the pub, and Anthony who acted as ringmaster on the night. Thanks are due to all those who have decorated the church for the Christmas season and again to Annette and Sarah for arranging the festive fare after the Carol Service. We are now looking forward to the School Christmas Assembly, the Crib Service, as well as carols in the Old Parsonage.

2026 is also an important year for us as we are due for our quinquennial inspection; every five years an architect carries out an intensive inspection of the fabric of the church. It is the ecclesiastical equivalent of an M.O.T.

One thing that might have escaped your notice is that the Government is phasing out the VAT relief on work on Grade I listed buildings (of which St. Mary's is one). This could have serious financial implications for us if the architect finds any major problem.
