No Room at the Inn



What a fantastic way to start our advent course. The session opened with a special festive greeting from the Rt Revd Andrew Watson, Bishop of Guildford. Bishop Andrew reminded the participants that 'Without Christ, Christmas is just M&S'.

This years course is based around Bear Grylls' book "The Greatest Story Ever Told". Week one centred around the Christmas Story and the Nativity. Since the courses have moved to the Sun Inn, the organisers have seen exponential growth, and let's just say that there was 'little room at the inn'. This is testament to the dedication of the team, and a lovely problem to have.



Joseph

The Bible does not document a significant amount about Joseph who is such an integral part of the Nativity story, Jesus upbringing and early life. Joseph was a descendant of King David, he was a carpenter who lived in Nazareth in Galilee. The gospel writers are careful to document that Jesus is God's son, but Joseph is considered to be Jesus earthly 'stepfather', teaching Jesus his trade as a carpenter, and raising him in accordance with Jewish law.

Although the Bible does not give many specifics about who Joseph was as a person—and the Bible records *no* actual words that Joseph spoke—we know enough to see that he was a humble man who faithfully obeyed God, honoured others, took responsibility, and worked hard to provide and protect his family from the authorities.

From the gospels of Luke and Matthew we do gain insight into the character of Joseph. It is noted that Joseph was a kind and righteous man. Not many characters in Scripture are documented for their righteousness. When Joseph found out that Mary was pregnant, he had the legal authority to divorce her, and it was his intention to do so quietly and without bringing public shame and disgrace on her. Joseph thus demonstrates that he is a man of integrity and dignity.

When the angel of the Lord appears to Joseph in Matthew's account of Jesus' birth, the angel tells Joseph not to be afraid and to take Mary as his wife. Joseph would have been concerned about public disgrace, humiliation and maybe even being cut off from his family. But Joseph shows that he is an obedient man with an incredible faith. Joseph chose to believe the unbelievable, and chose to trust in God's direction over the voices of family and the community.

When we look around at our world, it's tempting to think about all we risk losing if we follow what God tells us to do. And Joseph most likely had doubts and questions; he was human after all. But his questions and doubts led him back to the truth that God is in control. He was Joseph's ultimate source of truth and assurance.

God's words spoken through the angel were the only reason why Joseph was willing to take such a huge risk. God's words to you through Scripture are the reason that you can step out boldly.
