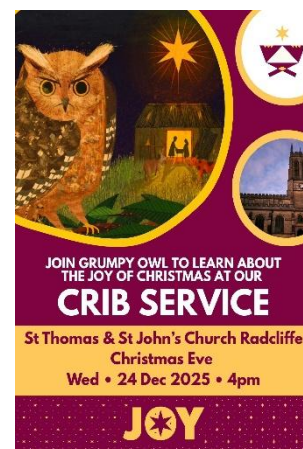

## Christmas Message from the Bishop of Manchester

*One of my favourite pieces of Christmas art was painted by the 17th century Dutch artist Rembrandt van Rijn. It shows two women, one of them Mary, gazing at the new-born Jesus, who is lying in His manger. The only source of light in the picture seems to come from the child Himself. It lights up the happy faces bent over Him. But everything else is totally dark. In a single image it encapsulates what St John addresses through words in the marvellous opening passage of His gospel. Here is unquenchable light, clothed in human form, shining out into a world of darkness.*

*St John wrote his gospel to Christians who lived in dark times, theirs was an age when hostile and brutal powers ruled the earth. When we look at our times, they often do not appear much brighter. Wars rage across the globe. Famine and terror drive many to seek refuge in foreign lands. Human made climate change destroys crops and devastates natural environments. The nations of our globe lie in thrall to a handful of powerful men, just as ruthless as any Roman Caesar. Yet in the midst of that darkness, Christ is, as ever, present, His birth standing as a divine assurance that the darkness will never totally win.*

*I turn to Rembrandt's image when things feel especially dark. There I see not only the light emanating from Jesus, but also its reflection in the faces of the women. They, and others who see His light and reflect it, will go on to change the world for ever, and for better. In his name they will feed the hungry, clothe the naked, tend the sick, educate the children, bring peace to warring states. In short, they will do miracles. And so can we.*

*My prayer therefore, is that, as we celebrate Christ's birth, we may both reflect His light and also celebrate the light we see reflected in one another – in acts of kindness, in shared worship, and in the love and service that binds our communities together.*

*May God bless you richly this Christmastide.*



## TEAM ADVENT STUDY GROUP

As in past years, a study group will meet during the weeks of Advent, on Fridays, 10:15 – 11:30am in St Thomas and St John's church. The first session will be on Friday 5 December., There is no need to register and it is free of charge. Beginning with a brew, we will then be guided by the Archbishop of York's pick as an Advent book: "Listening to the Music of the Soul", by Bishop Guli Francis-Dehqani. During the weeks of Advent, this study will replace the usual Friday Friends Bible Study.

It has been said that "Listening to the music of the soul" is a wonderfully evocative phrase – but what does it really mean for the everyday anxieties of life? Bishop Guli Francis-Dehqani invites us on the deepest journey of all: one within our very souls. To listen to the music of the soul, Bishop Guli writes, is to "connect in a meaningful way to our innermost being" – to release the pressure to be someone we are not, and inhabit our lives more fully, in deep and authentic relationship with God.

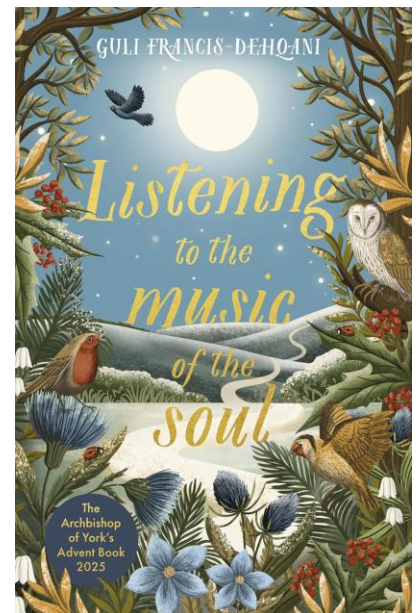
Bishop Guli's invitation is rooted in her own remarkable story. She arrived in the UK as a refugee forty years ago, following the murder of her brother in the wake of the Iranian Revolution. Growing up as a Christian in Iran and later fleeing to escape religious persecution, she knows exactly what it means to experience an identity shaped by complexity – and the struggle we all share to make sense of who we are.

In a highly digital world of social media soundbites, polarized debates, and the demand for instant responses, Bishop Guli offers another way. This Advent, her invitation to us to pause and "listen to the music of the soul", is a call to rest in life's nuances, in the fertile spaces in between, where beauty and pain coexist – and where, in that very tension, we encounter God most profoundly.

Relating her vivid life story to the biblical narratives of Advent, Bishop Guli encourages us to see our own journeys within the greater story of God's unending love and His purpose for our salvation. Each chapter invites us to listen to a musical interpretation of its theme (accessible via QR code), whether flight, angels, or hope, and encourages us to respond in a way that is deeply personal. From Mary's Magnificat and its hope for the overlooked, to the harmonies of silence and darkness, fear and hope, and light and space that accompany the season of Advent, *Listening to the Music of the Soul* draws into the beauty of God's reconciliation with humanity through the birth of Jesus.

The accompanying music to each chapter, whether familiar or not, becomes a companion to us on this journey, helping us tune our hearts to the deeper music of the soul. And in that inner music, we find ourselves drawn into the wider melody of God's love, where our lives are held within the heartbeat of His eternal song of salvation.

## In The Spotlight ... St. Andrew's, Radcliffe & Christ Church Walshaw

Over the last few months, both Christ Church, Walshaw, and St Andrew's, Radcliffe, have followed the Bible Course. Produced by the Bible Society, the course introduces the big story of the Bible over 8 sessions. There is a video for each session, with teaching from Andrew Ollerton, plus a short piece each week from an expert on the week's topic and a relevant testimony. It introduces a simple graphic which our churches have found really useful to remember the way the stories and different books of the Bible fit together. Each week suggests Bible passages to look at together and a few questions to discuss during a pause in the video. There is also a handbook available to accompany the course, plus lots of additional resources on the Bible Society's website. All resources are available for free on the Bible Society's website, except the handbook which costs £10 a copy, with discounts if you buy in bulk. We all found Andrew Ollerton really clear and easy to listen to. Each week starts with a recap of the story so far, so we could keep track of where we were up to as we went through. It's really accessible for new Christians, but at the same time even longstanding members of both churches found themselves learning new things! We have followed the course in existing home groups as well as in small groups set up just for this purpose. At the same time, we have followed a sermon series on Sundays built around the same themes. I would really recommend this excellent resource.

# Our Diocese: Our Vision

Bishop David writes:

Our vision is for Manchester Diocese to be a ***worshipping, growing, transforming Christian presence at the heart of every community***.

Much of what we are doing in Manchester Diocese is already contributing to a culture of hope and an expectation of growth, working with our parishes, schools and chaplaincies. This includes many forms of inherited as well as fresh expressions of church. We serve in an area that has a rich history of culture and innovation, made up of diverse and vibrant communities, and a longstanding commitment to social justice. It is a wonderful place to engage in Gospel Ministry.

Our work together grows out of Jesus's Great Commandment which is to 'love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind...and love your neighbour as yourself'. (Matthew 22: 36-40)...

... and out of his Great Commission, 'to go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and the Son and of the Holy Spirit' (Matthew 28:19-20).

Our strategy is based on positive, inspiring and relevant plans for the future. It is enabling us to bring together the key areas of opportunity and challenge, building on our learning and experience from the significant changes and investments that are already underway. Many of these changes have focused on new ways of working together which are becoming embedded in the life of our diocese.

Building on these successes, we are shifting to the next level in setting our priorities and working out what we want to achieve next. Given the excellent start that has been made, we now have the opportunity to be even more creative and ambitious with our plans for the future, based on the following distinct but interconnected themes:

Providing direct support for [parish renewal](#) is central to our work together. Our prayer and goal is to bring more people to faith in Jesus Christ and increase church attendance by a third over the next ten years. We are working closely with our parishes to understand the opportunities and challenges they face and secure their missional and financial future. Mission communities are key to this, enabling parishes to work together in serving their congregations and bringing new people to faith. Clergy deployment, parochial reorganisation and supporting our most fragile churches are important strands of this work. We are also strengthening the support we provide to church officers with training, resources and new technology.

We have been doing great work in the area of [growing younger](#), to ensure there is a thriving children and young people's ministry within reach of every young person and double the number of young active disciples in our churches. We have been trialling new approaches with the Children Changing Places project in Bolton, and Man Dio Growing Faith in the other six deaneries. We are now bringing this experience and learning together to develop a comprehensive approach to engaging with children and young people and their families across our diocese. Our particular focus is on how best to strengthen the links between our churches and our church schools supporting every parish and mission community with this.

We have had similar successes with [church planting and revitalisation](#). Over the last seven years, we have set up four new resource churches and over ten church plants. We want to build on the experience of our existing resource churches at the same time as

investing in new resource churches and new church plants, so that churches carrying a DNA of mission are established across our diocese, particularly in communities where attendance is low.

**Developing missional leaders** is a key priority for us so that we bring forward a new, diverse generation of mission-minded ordained and lay leaders. We recognise the importance of investing in our clergy so they are equipped to grow our churches, especially given the number of newly ordained clergy who are being appointed to stipendiary roles. As a diocese we continue to focus on developing our lay people, particularly through our Authorised Lay Ministry, Focal Ministry and Reader programmes. Supporting the vocations of clergy and lay people with the calling and skills to grow new faith communities, continues to be important to us.

In all of this we are deeply committed to championing **racial justice** and ensuring that our clergy, lay leaders and congregations represent the rich diversity of our diocese.

We are working towards the 2030 **net zero carbon** goal set by General Synod, by supporting our churches and schools with measuring their energy use and taking simple, practical steps to reduce their carbon footprint.

We will continue to provide a safe environment for all by promoting effective **safeguarding**.

Across our diocese, people hold diverse views and express their faith through **different traditions**, united in a passion for Jesus Christ and his Church. Our bishops honour these differences by inviting church communities from across our diocese to learn together, support one another and listen to God.

These priorities align with the Church of England's overall vision which is to create a church of missionary disciples, where mixed ecology is the norm, and whose membership is becoming younger and more diverse.
