David has faithfully served St. Leonard's for fourteen years as our organist and director of music. Through hymns, anthems, Evensongs, Christmas singing, and those unforgettable lockdown porch practices, David has helped us lift our voices and our spirits. His musical talent has enriched our worship; his wit, determination, and kindness have strengthened our choir and blessed our whole church family.

We are deeply grateful for the friendships he has built, the music he has inspired, and the dedication he has



shown week by week. We will miss him at the organ bench, but celebrate with him as he begins this next chapter.

This special edition of the Newsletter contains a reminder of David's gift and legacy and expresses our thanks to him. In our prayers we ask that God would bless him richly through his retirement.







David's legacy of wonderful music

In July 2011, a chance meeting in a Blackpool café set in motion something quite special for St Leonard's. Choir member Susan Walsh had known David many years. She knew that husband Philip and David "were boys together" in Marton Church Choir, Blackpool. She also knew that David was an accomplished pianist. With the post of Organist and Choirmaster vacant at the time, she wondered — half hopefully — whether he might consider coming to St Leonard's.

David came the very next Sunday to observe a service. He liked what he saw, introduced himself to Revd Nick, and the two got on immediately. The result was that David joined us as Director of Music, a role he held for thirteen and a half years, and more recently as our Organist.

Over those years, the choir and David shared many memorable moments — bowling trips, meals out, and of course the annual "Lancashire Sings Christmas" events at places like The Fleece, Penwortham Golf Club, The Brown Hare, and The Pear Tree Inn. The choir also enjoyed singing carols at the Penwortham Christmas Markets and visiting parishioners to sing outside their homes.

Monthly Choral Evensong became a highlight, with the choir learning a new psalm, anthem, and canticles each month. Our faithful congregation was often joined by friends from other churches who simply loved the music.

During the COVID lockdowns, when the church doors were closed, David kept everyone connected by setting up a choir WhatsApp group which met online every Thursday at 6.30pm — choir practice time. When restrictions eased, the choir gathered outside the main porch, spaced safely apart, with David playing the keyboard from the doorway. Neighbours later said they could hear the hymns from several streets away.









Under David's direction, the choir learned a great deal — glottal stops, the importance of watching the conductor, how to carry on regardless when the organ developed a cypher, when to stand for a hymn (never before the first note!), and, perhaps most importantly, how to stay completely still until the very last note faded. Watch!

And the music itself has been exceptional. David has led the choir in performing some truly beautiful pieces that have enriched our worship. His organ voluntaries at the end of services have often been met with spontaneous applause — a testament to both his skill and the joy he brought to our worship. Many of us will always remember trying not to "prance like ponies" out of church while he played the Radetzky March!

In December last year, David stepped down as Director of Music, and the choir thanked him with a gift



voucher for afternoon tea at Lytham Hall — a treat he thoroughly enjoyed. There was also a grand-piano-shaped cake, shared by all.

David, we will miss you. Thank you for everything you have brought to the music and worship of St Leonard's. We hope you enjoy your well-earned retirement.
