CASTLE ACRE PARISH COUNCIL – WINTER REPORT 2025

Castle Acre Parish Council (PC) held its regular monthly meeting on Thursday 13th November 2025, with one member of the public in attendance.

We would like your views on CAPC creating a PIIP 'Parish Investment & Infrastructure plan'. Due to a BCKLWN review and changes to CIL (Community Infrastructure Levy) funding, monies levied from new developments to Borough and Parish Councils. PCs are advised to create a 'PIIP' Parish Infrastructure and Investment Plan. CIL(2026) funding for projects between 10 and 100K will be possible via application from 1st March to 1st May 2026, applications should ideally be supported by a PIIP plan / and any match funding designated to projects that improve the infrastructure of the Village for the benefit of the local community. CAPC are asking Residents of our Village if there are any projects that should be considered. Please email the Clerk with your thoughts / ideas...

South Acre Ford TRO ref: WTRO5199.

On 04/11/2025 CAPC received a further notification from NCC/NP Law advising CAPC and Residents that the current temporary road restrictions will be extended until 27th February 2026. The continuation of the South Acre Road closure is owing to increased water levels and safety concerns for road users.

NCC Transport Dept. is currently consulting Castle Acre Parish Council as to any suggested improvements to the number 32 and Flexibus service with a view to making any changes required at Easter next year. THE DROVES AND HIGH GROVE SOLAR FARMS

A Threat to South Acre, Castle Acre and our surrounding communities.

Thanks to all who continue to engage with the consultation / planning process as it progresses for the two local proposed solar farms, **The Droves and High Grove.**

Castle Acre Parish Council urges residents to continue to be aware of these and the impact they will potentially have on our communities.

The Droves site alone covers over 2,000 + acres of productive farmland north of Swaffham, west of the A1065, (High Grove, in total, being considerably larger also to the west and to the east of the A1065). The Droves scheme includes approx. 25 acres allocated for a lithium battery storage site, 20 acres for high-voltage National Grid and solar compounds (up to 15 metres high), new 400kV pylons all to the west of the A1065, south and west of Bartholomew's Hills / Wood. Even after the Droves Solar farm is dismantled, the National Grid substation, about 10 acres in size, will remain permanently, much like the one now dominating the landscape at Necton.

We believe the visual and environmental impact will be immense: including thousands of steel piles driven up to 4 metres deep to support solar panels, wide trenches for high-voltage cables, and acres of concrete replacing fertile soil. Food production will be lost to these schemes. Heritage experts warn of potential damage to **archaeological remains**, including potential Roman and prehistoric sites beneath the fields.

The World Health Organization recommends solar farms be at least 2 km (1.2 miles) from residential areas, so protecting wellbeing, yet this development will sit just a short distance from parts of South Acre, with parts of Castle Acre and Swaffham also within this health guideline zone.

For many residents, the long-term impact on quality of life could be significant, due to noise, light pollution, and visual blight. These are not small local solar projects; they are **industrial power stations covering large areas of agricultural land** in the heart of our historic countryside. Once built, they will dominate our landscape, damage our heritage, and impact the quality of our lives for generations.

We understand there will be opportunities for you to register with the Planning Inspectorate enabling you to make further representation to the independent Examining Authority once the DCO (Development Consent Order) applications have been submitted to the Secretary of State (SoS) through the (PINS) by the developers.

Castle Acre Parish Council is not opposed to the production of solar energy, we are however opposed to the plans for massive industrial-scale solar farms to be built on agricultural land between Swaffham, Castle Acre and South Acre, threatening to permanently change the landscape, heritage, and tranquility of our villages for the next 60+ years.

Please continue to inform yourselves, attend meetings, write objections so that we stand together to help protect our landscape, heritage, and communities from these vast developments.







JUDITH'S FAILSAFE FRUITCAKE

cooked in an oven temperature of 135° centigrade for 2 hours

- 8oz self-raising flour
- 12oz mixed fruit vou could add a few cherries to this



NAR VALLEY ORNITHOLOGICAL SOCIETY (NarVOS)

Indoor meeting at The Assembly Rooms, 1 Market Place, Swaffham PE37 7AB

Wednesday 28 January 2026 at 7.30pm The Adventures of a (Geriatric!) Bird Nester – Presented by Allan Hale

Allan Hale has been a NarVOS member since the society's inaugural meeting back in 1976. He has been interested in birds for as long as he can remember — probably as a result of his father breeding canaries. He has held a bird ringing licence for more than 50 years, has travelled widely (to more than 100 countries, including a spell working in the Netherlands). His bird ringing trips have taken him to Cyprus, the US, Brazil, The Gambia and Senegal, and he ran the ringing laboratory at Thunder Cape Bird Observatory in Ontario, Canada for six springs and two autumns. His claim to fame is having slept in the same bed as Princess Anne — but not at the same time!

This talk includes some of the highlights of the last 16 years of Allan's bird nesting. This timeframe is significant as it marks when he started submitting Nest Record Cards to the BTO in computerised form. He's submitted more than 2,800 cards across 69 species, all with multiple visits. Many of the nests have been in boxes constructed and erected by skilled NarVOS member Jonathan Hall. Over the years, Jonathan's constructions have been used by no fewer than 28 avian and six other species, ranging from the diminutive Pygmy Shrew to the hostile Hornet. The presentation covers owls, Peregrines and Tree Sparrows in some detail, plus several harder-to-find species.




