Your Monthly Update from Earley St Peter's – January 2026



Thought for the month from the Revd Kate Wakeman-Toogood

I wonder how many of us will begin 2026 with New Year's Resolutions. Of those resolutions, I wonder how many of them are realistic enough to keep, and how many are promises we are making to ourselves which are unrealistic and will lead us to unnecessary and unhelpful feelings of failure and frustration. We've all been there!

Whilst I have personal new year's resolutions, one thing that I am determined to do as a vicar is to be braver and bolder in addressing some of the more difficult issues that it is in our human nature to avoid or postpone. For those of you who hadn't guessed it, the main thing I am talking about is money!

Last year we had a generous giving campaign and we were delighted to see some positive effects. Regular monthly giving increased and we are immensely grateful to everybody who did respond to the campaign in this way. However, for a variety of other reasons we lost income last year and so the reality is that we need to reclaim momentum with regards to giving, and ensure that these generous giving campaigns happen regularly.

I am writing this at the start of a new year because it would also be a good opportunity for people to revisit the literature that we shared last year, particularly about the significant deficit that we faced. This year we are projected a similarly large deficit. Whilst fundraising and gift days are useful, it is regular giving that will make the difference, particularly as the cost of running the church and the hall has increased **and** we are increasingly offering more services, groups, and events. Our approach to generous giving is a marathon rather than a sprint.

Reading back through the last couple of paragraphs, I do feel it is a bold move talking about money and giving at the start of a new year, particularly as many of us feel the financial pinch after Christmas. But I am not asking people to empty their wallets, but rather to think about our attitude towards giving - and I include myself in that - and how we can work together to serve God and our community, and resource at Church so that each member can flourish.

I want to end this reflection by launching 'Life in all its fullness 2026', which was something I started last year and will continue due to its success. As you may remember, part of this is pulling together the many different things we already do and advertising the programme of learning and training opportunities for the year ahead. Please keep an eye out on our notice boards, website and social media for the Life in all its fullness 2026' posters at the start of January.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity runs from Sunday 18 - Sunday 25 January and this year's theme is based on Ephesians 4: There is one Body and one Spirit. As we did last year, we will be providing a simple booklet of prayers and reflections which you can pick up in church on Sunday 18 January.

International food and fellowship evening

On Saturday 24 January we are delighted to be holding a special event to mark the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Hospitality is one thing that unites people across different cultures and backgrounds, and this evening will be a chance to enjoy food from various countries and to spend time with one another. There will also be a fun quiz to do on your tables and a short act of worship to begin the evening, based on the theme of the week.

The suggested donation is £5 but we appreciate not everyone will be able to afford this. More details will be announced in church, weekly bulletins and posters in early January.

Lent Group 2026 - A Journey Through Lent: There will be a Lent group running on Tuesdays from 7.30pm until 9.00pm throughout the Lenten period. It will begin on Tuesday 24 February and conclude on Tuesday 31 March. A warm invitation to participate is extended to you. The course will be looking at what Lent means to us, alongside the period of wilderness that Christ experienced during the 40 days spent in the desert. The sessions will be based on the spirituality of St. Ignatius, and will include imaginative contemplation of scriptural passages, as well as other practical aids to assist in this study period. There will be group discussion and quiet time built into each session.

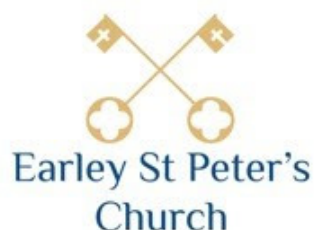
Dates for your diary
