


Christingle Service

What is a **Christingle?**

Christingle is a joyful celebration that brings families and communities together to have fun, share the light of Jesus, and spread a message of hope.

In 1968, John Pensom of The Children's Society held our first Christingle celebration in Lincoln Cathedral as a way of raising funds to help children and young people.

Since then, thousands more churches, schools, and communities across the country have joined the tradition and come together each year to sing, celebrate, and stand alongside the young people who need someone to be there for them.

We remain seated as we take in part in the first reflection.

Confession

We remain seated or kneel.

We sit as we listen to any family news and notices.

Lighting our Christingles and singing our final hymn We stand as able and move to the edges of the building to create a big circle. The two standing closest to the Advent wreath will light their candles and pass the flame around until all are lit. When everyone's Christingle is lit we sing together as a sign or our commitment to be light Longing for light, we wait in darkness. Longing for truth, we turn to you. Make us your own, your holy people, light for the world to see.

PCC TREASURER NEEDED – URGENT

We urgently need someone to take on the role of Treasurer. This is an important role in the life of the church. You do not need to be an expert in finances, just a willingness to learn and computer literacy. Terry Daniels, our interim treasurer will work with you to ensure a handover and you will have the support of the Wardens and PCC. As a PCC member you will need to complete some Safeguarding modules and have an enhanced DBS. Please speak to Jenni or Terry if you think you may be able to take on this role.

HOLY COMMUNION SERVER(S) NEEDED

We are seeking a new member (or perhaps members!) to join our team of Holy Communion servers. This role includes assisting with the preparation of the altar, helping with the distribution of Holy Communion and clearing at the end of the service. Due to the nature of our building Servers need to be able to use stairs. Full training will be given, including Basic Awareness Safeguarding which is imperative for any volunteer role in the church. Please speak to Jenni or Ian if this interests you.

VOLUNTEER NEEDED: PARISH SAFEGUARDING COORDINATOR (PSC)

After over a decade in this role Anne Harris intends to step down at the next APCM. We are seeking to recruit in time for a smooth handover from Anne and for the next PSC to work alongside Mike Baynham as part of a team.

This role is; to work with the incumbent and PCC in promoting safeguarding within the parish, and to ensure that church leaders are implementing the Church of England's safeguarding guidance. The Parish Safeguarding Coordinator is the key link person between the parish and the Diocesan Safeguarding Team.

This role requires an enhanced DBS and completion of several training modules offered by the Diocese. Good computer literacy is essential for this as it includes working with a database.

If you think this might be something you would be interested in and God is calling you to consider it, please speak to Anne Harris or Jenni Crewes. We can offer you a more detailed role description.

Please pray for the right person to be recruited for this essential aspect of parish life.
