7th Dec: Advent 2

Almighty God, purify our hearts and minds, that when your Son Jesus Christ comes again as judge and saviour, we may be ready to receive him who is our Lord and our God.

14th Dec: Advent 3

God for whom we watch and wait, you sent John the Baptist to prepare the way of your Son: give us courage to speak the truth, to hunger for justice and to suffer for the cause of right, with Jesus Christ our Lord.

10th Dec: St Deiniol



With Catherine heading off to north Wales, it seems appropriate to choose a saint from that area. Indeed Deiniol is the founding bishop, in the 6th century, of the Diocese of Bangor, which includes Anglesey.
Unlike Catherine coming from the

south, Deiniol seems to have come the north. He is responsible not just for a monastery at Bangor, but also for another at Bangor-on-Dee towards Chester. That reputedly had 2000 monks before they were slaughtered by the pagan king of Northumbria. Clearly Deiniol was regarded as of significance. He was on a par with St.

significance. He was on a par with St. David at a high level meeting at Llandewi Brefi. And Gladstone, hundreds of years later, dedicated his library to Deiniol at Hawarden, near Chester.

Deiniol died on 11th September, 584, but for some reason is remembered by some in December. We take advantage of that, and pray for a new bishop of Bangor to be appointed.

He died at Bangor, but along with many of the Welsh saints, was buried on Bardsey Island..

The Diocese of Bangor is delighted to announce the appointment of a new Ministry Area Leader




for Bro Padrig in the Archdeaconry of Anglesey in the Diocese of Bangor. The Revd. Catherine Duff who serves currently as a member of the Torridge Team Mission Community in rural North Devon in the Diocese of Exeter has been appointed after a recent interview process. Catherine has a decade of experience working in the education system before entering lay and then the ordained ministry in the Church of England. We look forward to her coming among us to lead the next phase of life for our Ministry Area, joining our Ministry Team with the Revd. Glenys Samson. Please pray for Catherine in this time, and for the people and churches of the Torridge Team Mission Community where Catherine currently serves.

So in February I will be leaving you all and heading northwards to Wales. The Bro Padrig Ministry Area covers the north-western part of Anglesey with the villages of Cemaes, Llanfechell and Llanfaethlu along with a scattering of farming and fishing communities. If you have seen the news of a new nuclear power station being developed in Anglesey, that is the very place! The area is named Bro Padrig after St. Patrick. He is said to have been shipwrecked in a storm just off the coast while travelling back to Ireland. I will be taking the post of Ministry Area Leader across seven churches, two of which only have summer services as there's no heating or lighting and you have to trek across fields to get to them. I will be learning Welsh as 50% of the population of Anglesey speak Welsh. Services are usually bilingual, so I get the challenge of learning how to do this right from the beginning. Of course the joy of moving onwards is tinged with the sadness of leaving here. The Torridge Team Mission Community has been a wonderful place to be a curate and train at the beginning of ordained ministry, mostly because of how encouraging and supportive everyone has been. I shall miss you and always be very thankful for you all. Many blessings, Catherine.

Book ReviewNormal, Imperfect Heroes by James Grier, with Liz Grier

It's not often that we get a book produced by one of our own, so it is



good to celebrate when it is. This one is by the present Bishop of Plymouth, a Devon boy through and through (with his wife's help!)

And even more so when it is written about us! Well, not you and me, and ordinary folk like you and me. Ordinary folk, who God uses. And their stories are in the Bible.

James is keen to address our culture that tends to either applaud people, or to write them off. They are either in or they're out. Fortunately God doesn't see it that way.

James riffles through the Bible, helping us see how so many of the heroes of Scripture were actually ordinary fallible human beings – just like you and me. But God didn't write them off – he still loved them, he still worked through them. And that's not just the men, but the women as well. Ok, so there aren't as many examples of women as men in the Bible – but maybe you could find a few more.

It is an easily accessible book, and so an easy read. James weaves in his and Liz's (Liz is his wife) experiences. As a result it is not just a book reflecting on the characters of the Bible, but helps us to see its relevance today.

And don't be put off by the subtitle about leadership. Whether in leadership or not, we need to pray for and support our leaders. But actually this isn't just about leaders — it's about us all. For every disciple of Jesus, every Christian, every one of us has our shortcomings, but every one of us is still loved by God, and valued by God.


