Matthew 11:2-11

² When John, who was in prison, heard about the deeds of the Messiah, he sent his disciples ³ to ask him, 'Are you the one who is to come, or should we expect someone else?'

⁴ Jesus replied, 'Go back and report to John what you hear and see: ⁵ the blind receive sight, the lame walk, those who have leprosy are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the good news is proclaimed to the poor. ⁶ Blessed is anyone who does not stumble on account of me.'

⁷As John's disciples were leaving, Jesus began to speak to the crowd about John: 'What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed swayed by the wind? ⁸ If not, what did you go out to see? A man dressed in fine clothes? No, those who wear fine clothes are in kings' palaces. ⁹ Then what did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. ¹⁰ This is the one about whom it is written:

"I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you."

¹¹ Truly I tell you, among those born of women there has not risen anyone greater than John the Baptist; yet whoever is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.

Gaudete Sunday

Today the Church celebrates Gaudete Sunday, the Third Sunday of Advent and the midpoint of the Advent season. Only one Sunday remains before the Eve of the Nativity. The word gaudete is Latin for "Rejoice," the first word in the traditional Introit for the Third Sunday of Advent. On Gaudete Sunday the Church changes the tone of its preparation for the coming of the Lord is at hand. The mood now shifts from sober expectation to growing joy. Today we light the pink candle in the Advent wreath.

The Gospel reading features John the Baptist in prison asking questions, but with an unwavering conviction that Jesus, who is mightier than he, is coming, and that gives hope that God's promises of justice and salvation are being fulfilled.
