

As I've said before, thank God for diversity. We are all individuals gifted with unique likes and dislikes, strengths and weaknesses, tastes and preferences. What one thinks is great, another will find aweful. And this is as true of Christmas as anything else in

Whilst some enjoy Christmas, others dislike it. Even among the fans of Christmas, different elements appeal. For some, it's the films and music, the shopping or decorating the house. For others it's the time spent with family, the cards received from people we haven't have seen for many years or the break from work. What brings joy to one person may not appeal to another.

Now I'm not saying I'm a baa humbug, but last Christmas my wife, Claire brought me a Christmas jumper. This is the first Christmas jumper I have ever had. It's a plain blue hoodie with the words, 'This is my Christmas Jumper' written in large letters across the front. Even growing up, within my family I was know as the miserable so and so that doesn't do Christmas!

This isn't true. I enjoy Christmas. But for me, Christmas begins on Christmas Eve and ends with the Feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple. During this time, we celebrate the nativity of Our Lord, and trace - admittedly in a truncated and disjointed way - Christ birth and childhood.

I love doing Christmas with Claire on Boxing Day, exchanging gifts and cooking lunch. I especially enjoy the buffet tea with tasty cheeses, cold meats and pickles whilst watching 'proper' Christmas films like The Lemon Drop Kid, Die Hard or Scrouged. But as much as I enjoy the festivities of Christmas Day, it's the journey through the season proper that makes it such a wonderful time for me.

For forty days we make our spiritual journey through Christmastide recalling Jesus' early life. We recall His first visit to the Temple for His naming, Mary's purification and Jesus' circumcision and the visit of the Magi. We hear of the flight of the Holy Family to Egypt and of the teenaged Jesus missing for three days.

As the story of Jesus' birth and childhood unfold, we are reminded that the Holy Family didn't have an easy life. They experienced the same highs and lows that parenting brings which many of us may have experienced. Mary and Joseph felt the same feelings of pride and joy that parent's today feel when people meet the newborn child. They knew the inexpressible fear and hopelessness that many of us have felt when our child wanders off. They experienced the wonder of angelic visitors, shepherds and kings. But they also experienced things that many of us cannot imagine - persecution, homelessness, exile from their homeland and life as refugees, things still prevalent in the world today. Our Lord grew up in a family home just like many of us did, with the same joys and sadness, the same celebrations and desolations.

I love Christmas, but I like it like my Christmas Jumper... plain, simple and to the point. And the point of Christmas is that God humbled Himself and came down to earth from heaven to experience all that it means to be human. And having experienced the highs and lows of life on earth, with its pleasures and its pains, He invites us to share in His divine nature. He became like us so that we can become like

Everybody is different because we are all unique individuals. For some, Christmas is a joyful time. For others, it's a painful time. Some renew old friendships; others regret loves lost. Some spend it with their family whilst others are alone. I pray that whatever Christmas means to you and however you 'do' Christmas, you be filled with His peaceful presence.

Preparing for Christmas: Inside St. George's Parish Church Choir and our Journey to 'Carols by Candlelight'

As December approaches and Advent candles begin to glow, the choir of St. George's Parish Church in New Mills steps into its busiest and most joyful season of the year. Christmas at St. George's is always something special, but the centrepiece of the celebrations is undoubtedly the 'Carols by Candlelight' Nine Lessons and Carols Service.

For the choir, this service is not just a date in the calendar, it is the culmination of months of preparation, dedication, and a shared love of music.

In the run-up to Christmas, rehearsals intensify. Under the guidance of Tim Hawkins, their Director of Music, the choir meets to polish harmonies, refine diction, and shape the expressive musical storytelling that gives Christmas services their warmth and power.

Music folders thicken with pieces old and new. Traditional hymns like "O Come, All Ye Faithful" and "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing," sit beside contemporary carol settings and Christmas anthems chosen especially for this year's service.

Each rehearsal is a blend of focus and fun: moments of close concentration mixed with laughter and camaraderie.

The Carols by Candlelight Nine Lessons and Carols Service is one of the musical high points of Advent at St. George's. The church will be transformed as candles flicker around the church. The gentle light turns St. George's into a place of stillness and wonder.


The service follows the well-loved pattern first established at King's College, Cambridge—nine readings from Scripture telling the story of salvation, each followed by a carol that reflects the message.

As the date approaches. There will be final rehearsals, last-minute polishing, and perhaps a few nerves, but above all, a sense of privilege. For the members of St. George's Choir, sharing the music of Christmas is one of the greatest joys of the year.

Whether you are a regular at St. George's or have never stepped inside the church before, you are warmly invited to join us for **Carols by Candlelight** on **Sunday 21st December** at **6.30pm**.

Come early, bring a friend, and let the glow of candlelight, the beauty of sacred music, and the voices of St. George's Parish Church Choir lead you into the heart of Christmas.

And the joy doesn't end when the final notes fades. After the service, all are invited to stay behind and enjoy mulled wine and mince pies!

CHURCH FLOWERS

The flowers we use in church are important to us as they symbolize the seasons of the Christian year and each season has its own colour.

In Lent and Advent there are no flowers as these seasons are for reflection and fasting and they lead to our most important and holy days. So, on Good Friday we honour Jesus' agony in the garden with white flowers in the Lady chapel and burst forth with joy into gold and white at Easter and Christmas after our few weeks of contemplation.

By Pentecost when the fire of the Holy Spirit is upon us, we can break out into red, followed swiftly by the green of Trinity which encompasses our going out into the world to bring back those who are Lost, so all the colours or the rainbow can be used.

We like to think of St George on his day in April with a few red roses by his statue and our fallen are remembered in November with poppies.

If anyone wants a special occasion to be remembered, we can usually remember that too. It seems a while since we did any wedding flowers, but we can be here for that if necessary.

In the past we have had many flower festivals on various themes From weddings, saints and bible stories. Unfortunately, they are very expensive to run, and we have found to our cost that we are not a tourist area.

St. George's Nurture Group Saint George's Nurture Group is a relaxed and light hearted

Saint George's Nurture Group is a relaxed and light hearted group which meets to talk about some aspects of our faith and life.

The group is for anyone, from those beginning to ask questions about God, faith and the Church to life long Christians. It doesn't matter how long you've been going to church, discipleship is a life long journey of growth in faith. We learn new things about God, our faith and ourselves every day. This group is an ideal safe space to grapple with such things in a supportive and inclusive environment.

Nor is there any need to attend every session. You are free to dip in and out for the topics that appeal or as your other commitments allow.

Topics vary from week to week, but we follow this pattern over the course of each month:

Week 3: Ways of Praying – we explore themes of a spiritual nature, such as prayers of adoration, understanding the Eucharist and writing a rule of life

Week 4: Bible Book Club – we explore a book of the Bible each month using The Bible Society's Bible Book Club resources.
