FIRST READING Isaiah 52:7-10

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of the messenger who announces peace, who brings good news, who announces salvation, who says to Zion, "Your God reigns." Listen! Your sentinels lift up their voices, together they sing for joy; for in plain sight they see the return of the LORD to Zion. Break forth together into singing, you ruins of Jerusalem; for the LORD has comforted his people, he has redeemed Jerusalem. The LORD has bared his holy arm before the eyes of all the nations; and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.

PSALM Psalm 98

R All the ends of the earth have seen the victory of our God.

Sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvellous things. With his right hand and his holy arm has he won for himself the victory. R

The Lord has made known his victory; his righteousness has he openly shown

in the sight of the nations. He remembers his mercy and faithfulness to the house of Israel, and all the ends of the earth have seen

the victory of our God. R

Shout with joy to the Lord, all you lands;

lift up your voice, rejoice and sing. Sing to the Lord with the harp, with the harp and the voice of song. With trumpets and the sound of the horn

shout with joy before the King, the Lord. R

Let the sea make a noise and all that is in it,

the lands and those who dwell therein.

Let the rivers clap their hands, and let the hills ring out with joy before the Lord,

when he comes to judge the earth. In righteousness shall he judge the world,

and the peoples with equity. R

SECOND READING

Hebrews 1:1-4 [5-12]

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom he also created the worlds. He is the reflection of God's glory and the exact imprint of God's very being, and he sustains all things by his powerful word. When he had made purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs. [For to which of the angels did God ever say, "You are my Son; today I have begotten you"? Or again, "I will be his Father, and he will be my Son"? And again, when he brings the firstborn into the world, he says, "Let all God's angels worship him." Of the angels he says, "He makes his angels winds, and his servants flames of fire." But of the Son he says, "Your throne, O God, is for ever and ever, and the righteous sceptre is the sceptre of your kingdom. You have loved

righteousness and hated wickedness; therefore God, your God, has anointed you with the oil of gladness beyond your companions." And, "In the beginning, Lord, you founded the earth, and the heavens are the work of your hands; they will perish, but you remain; they will all wear out like clothing; like a cloak you will roll them up, and like clothing they will be changed. But you are the same, and your years will never end."]

GOSPEL John 1:1-14

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man but of God. And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.

Christmas Trees: the trees in each of our church buildings have been generously supplied by Harwich Independent Funeral Services and we are very appreciative of their annual gift.

Homeless: a sheet with information on the parish agreed response to homeless people on our grounds is now available and is commended by the Archdeacon of Colchester. It was written by the Rector.

St Nicholas roof and chairs: we have discovered that the hopper heads may be full of debris and rain is not discharging as it should; this could damage the building. The diocese sent a drone to fly and investigate free of charge. We are seeking a contractor to deal with the issue. You will notice a difference in the sanctuary as the blue chairs move out, and the area is reclaimed as a sacred space not a furniture store.

All Saints drainage and clock: an examination was undertaken on Monday 1st. The situation is more serious and may require sections of the churchyard to be dug up to clear the drainage pipes. After months of waiting one of the conservation societies has asked for more detail about the clock restoration. We are supplying that as quickly as possible to get a date early in 2026 for the work to start.

Peninsula Post 5: is out now and covers the end and start of 2025/2026. We welcome your own contributions for the next editions. The next edition is on its way and being written now! Contributions to it are welcome.

Epiphany: we hope to have a service on Tuesday 6th January at All Saints at 7pm to mark Epiphany. This is the feast celebrating the unveiling or the revelation of God to the Gentiles (us) represented by the Magi. **Future dates – 2026**: for those who like to plan ahead; Sunday 28th December Sioux will lead a Taizé service at All Saints at 10.30am; Tuesday 6th January 7pm an Epiphany service in All Saints; Sunday 25th January at 5pm a service for Churches Together in Harwich at the end of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity in All Saints (please feel free to use Kingsway Church Car Park). The Annual Parochial Church Meeting will take place on Wednesday May 13th at which meeting we elect the new PCC and Wardens for the year ahead. **School Assemblies and Residential Care Home Services**: please remember that as the new school term begins on the 5th January Ian will be weekly at St Michael's school each Monday morning and All Saints school each Friday morning. Each first Tuesday of the month there is a service at Don Thomson home at 11am and each second Monday at Lime Court home also at 11am. Support at these residential homes is welcome; please be ready to go in just before 11am.
