

Advent: The Art of Waiting Well

There's something in the air at this time of year - a kind of charged stillness, like the pause before the first note of a symphony. Advent is the season of waiting, but not the sort of waiting we do in a queue at the Post Office, shifting from foot to foot and checking the clock. Advent waiting is different. It's active, alert, expectant - the sort of waiting that leans forward rather than slumps back.

We know what we're waiting for, of course: Christmas. But the Church has always taught that Advent isn't just about looking back to Bethlehem, but also looking ahead - to Christ's coming again, and to his quiet coming among us in the everyday moments of now. It's a season that stretches our sense of time, reminding us that God's promises are not bound by our calendars, and that sometimes what we need most is to be still and make room.

That's not easy in December. The shops have been in full festive throttle since October, and our diaries fill faster than our stockings. The temptation is to rush through Advent so that we can "get to" Christmas. Yet if we skip the waiting, we miss the wonder. The early Christians called this time Adventus

- a word meaning both *arrival* and *presence*. The two belong together: if we never learn to wait, we never truly recognise the presence when it comes.

Perhaps the waiting itself is a gift. Like a seed beneath the soil, there's a quiet work going on in us while we wait - a deepening of hope, a strengthening of trust. The prophet Isaiah wrote, "Those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength." Waiting is not wasted time; it's soulbuilding time.

So this Advent, perhaps we might practise waiting well. Light a candle in the window, take a few quiet moments each day, resist the rush to finish everything, and simply notice. Notice where hope is stirring. Notice where love is already at work. Notice how Christ is nearer than we thought.

When the angels sing "Glory to God in the highest," they will not be breaking the silence so much as completing it - the long, beautiful silence of a people who have learned how to wait. And that, perhaps, is the real miracle of Christmas.

As in previous years, St Richards will be additionally giving out a "special" Christmas bag. These have always been so gratefully received, and we try to include some treats / items they would not usually be able to afford.

The items we are aiming to include in these bags include:

- Tinned ham (large size ~ 300g-400g)
- · Some very nice / luxury biscuits
- Mince pies
- Evaporated or Condensed milk tins
- Tinned fruit
- Some fresh cheese & cheese biscuits
- A small Christmas cake / fruit cake / pudding (if affordable)
- Vegetables (fresh or tinned)
- Small selection boxes
- Satsumas

Our Benefice has agreed to concentrate on getting sufficient tins of ham for the bags... so would be very grateful if you could collect as many as you can. And drop off by the first week in December, after which we will then be making up the bags.

Children aged 2-11: 40% of adult price



At the Shops

- Think before you buy: gold does not always glitter brightly. A new £500 gold necklace has a carbon emissions tag of 400kg CO2e, the mining process damages landscapes, ecosystems and contaminates water, and can be associated with human rights violations.
- Think before you buy: the manufacture of a new car uses a lot of energy and resources which generate 6 tonnes CO2e for a small vehicle (more than half your total year's carbon budget), 17 tonnes for an estate car and up to 35 tonnes for a top of the range Land Rover.
- ⇒ Buy local and in season produce and look forward to seasonal changes. For example a punnet of strawberries flown in or grown locally in a hothouse in winter has a 1.8kg CO2e emissions cost. Whereas locally grown in the UK in summer its only 0.15kg a punnet.
- ⇒ Do you really need a new computer, laptop or phone? Manufacturing new goods has a high environmental cost. A new laptop has a carbon footprint of 200kg and a high end desk top 800kg CO2e.
- ⇒ Think ahead to Christmas! How can you show love in your gift giving without costing the earth? Discuss having a Secret Santa or a price limit with family members, choose small thoughtful presents, or hand make gifts.




