



A NEW YEAR OF LIFE

As you read this, some of you will be reflecting that you have had a great Christmas and others might want to say 'moving on'... and many of us will be experiencing or anticipating the January blues! All of these responses are part of us just being human, but is there anything that our Christian faith and our Lord can teach us in this new start to another year?

Psalm 90:12 says 'teach us to 'number your days that we might gain a heart of wisdom.' I have since my early days as a Christian understood this phrase to mean three things. First, that our lives are a wonderful gift. We can sometimes think that life and or our Maker owe us something rather than thanking the Lord for His mercy and love even if in a season of challenge we have to work harder to remind ourselves of His goodness. Second, it means our days are 'numbered'! Goodness does that mean that we can't assume we will live long or even be happy all the time?! I think it does and reminds us of this phrase from Psalm 139: 16 'all the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be'! Third, we must live carefully knowing that one day we will be held to account for how we have lived.

So... how can we respond positively to this challenge? Here is a suggestion. Review 2025 and pray to the Lord that by His Spirit He might help you discern what you should leave behind, what you should celebrate and take with you into 2026 and what might the Lord want to give you in 2026 and what are you asking Him for. Finally, remember this, we are only pilgrims here on earth and we look forward to being with our Lord in paradise! In the mean time may we honour the Lord and say 'what a wonderful world'!

- ♥ **Waking the Dawn** is every Saturday, 8am - 9am. All are welcome to come and pray.


Parish activities and beyond
