ROMANS IN THE NEW TESTAMENT - FELIX

Antoninus Felix was appointed Governor of Judea in AD 52. His entire 8 year rule was chaotic and cruel, treating the Jews with great brutality. He was an immoral man seducing Drusilla, daughter of King Herod Agrippa 1 from her husband. He was also very greedy accepting bribes in great quantities.

Paul was sent to him from Jerusalem. He was manifestly not guilty, but Felix held him in custody for two years, hoping he would receive a payment from him to be released, which Paul refused to do.

One redeeming feature perhaps; he seems genuinely interested in Paul's teachings and listened to him on a number of occasions, without however changing his ways. Something in him must have been stirred by Paul's message.

Felix was recalled to Rome in disgrace in AD 60 but escaped any punishment.
