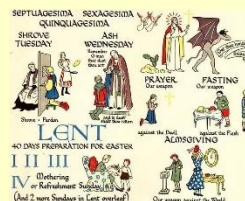

HEATING AND ENERGY SOLUTIONS

A MESSAGE FROM DAVID CLARKE, CHURCH WARDEN, ST GILES' CHURCH, WHITTINGTON:

Do you enjoy coming into our warm church? We are proud to be able to offer a church where you don't have to prepare for visiting by putting on several extra layers of clothing. We want to keep it that way! Our gas-fired boilers are getting on for 15 years old, and whilst they are working well just now, and are serviced every year, they clearly won't last for ever. In addition, heat distribution within the church is less than effective with only four radiators to heat a very large and poorly insulated space. Furthermore, Lichfield Diocese will demand that we have explored every opportunity to be greener and more efficient in our energy usage. The Parochial Church Council is determined to have a plan in place for our heating and energy usage for when the day comes that we need to make changes. We are putting together a small sub-committee to explore all the possibilities, both in terms of heat-delivery systems and potential sources of funding. **Do you have the skills to help us?
