First Reading Isaiah 42:1-4. 6-7
In the first of the "Suffering Servant" songs, God's chosen one is described as gently bringing true justice to the nations.

Second Reading Acts 10:34-38
Peter begins instructing the Gentile convert Cornelius with the story of Jesus' baptism.

Gospel Matthew 3:13-17
Matthew's account of Jesus' baptism.

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

He will not cry aloud or lift up his voice,
or make it heard in the street;
a bruised reed he will not break,
and a faintly burning wick he will not quench;
he will faithfully bring forth justice.
He will not grow faint or be discouraged
till he has established justice in the earth;
and the coastlands wait for his law.

'I am the LORD; I have called you in righteousness;
I will take you by the hand and keep you;
I will give you as a covenant for the people,
a light for the nations,
to open the eyes that are blind,
to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon,
from the prison those who sit in darkness.'

Christ – he is Lord of all – you yourselves know what happened
throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that
John proclaimed: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the
Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing
all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.'

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew.

be baptised by him. John would have prevented him, saying, 'I
need to be baptised by you, and do you come to me?' But Jesus
answered him, 'Let it be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfil
all righteousness.' Then he consented. And when Jesus was
baptised, immediately he went up from the water, and behold,
the heavens were opened to him, and he saw the Spirit of God
descending like a dove and coming to rest on him; and behold, a
voice from heaven said, 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am
well pleased.'
