A Message from Reverend Bob

A Lenten Journey for Everyone?

Lent offers each of us the opportunity to consider our own lives and relationships: particularly our relationships with those around us, whether within our families, our local communities, the whole World, and indeed, with God, while also perhaps reassessing and altering our own personal thoughts and behaviours towards a better future for all.

Lent is a period during which many of us both emulate the trials of Christ during his forty days of temptation in the wilderness, and undertake a time of abstinence and preparation for both the trials and sacrifice of Good Friday, but also for the joy and celebration of Easter. It is also a time when people give up something they enjoy, such as chocolate, beer, or anything else that might be a bit of a treat, and put the money saved aside for donation towards charity – whether that be the church itself, or some other good cause. These activities can be wrapped up in what are often termed the three pillars of Lent, which are activities targeted towards generating greater levels of justice towards others within our lives. These are:

1. Justice towards God - through prayer and contemplation
2. Justice towards ourselves - through fasting and self-denial
3. Justice towards our neighbours, both local and distant - through almsgiving, care, and consideration.

These processes, or concepts, lend themselves towards a process of self-assessment and realignment that can be beneficial to everyone, no matter how deep their faith, or indeed what their religious beliefs are, and signifies that this period shouldn't just focus on material abstinence and diversion of money from one way of spending to another, essential though this is, but should also cover our attitudes to others – to the lost, the least and the last in our world.

Finally, may the perspectives I offer give you food for thought, and an opportunity for personal enrichment to the good of yourself and the World around us, whatever your core beliefs. But, and by the way, while I'm encouraging us all to take a deeper look at our inner selves, please do continue to give something up, and give the money to charity!
