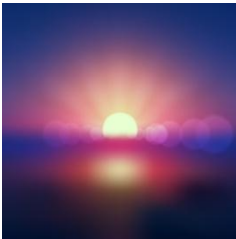

CLERGY THOUGHTS

WHAT NOW!!!

For many, now we are in a new year, Christmas and its jollity is behind us, done and dusted - once brightly illuminated trees are now squeezed back in their boxes in the dark of the loft, or bound for the great shredder or donkey fodder! Decorations neatly packed ready for next Christmas-tide.

But that is disappointing – in the Church the Christmas season only starts on Christmas Day and concludes this year on February 2nd – on the celebration of the Presentation in the Temple, often known as Candlemas, and marks the end of the remembrance of the Jesus' nativity and infancy. This is when the Church should down its festive decorations.

The mismatch between the popular season and the reason for the season seems to widen each year, especially since some Easter eggs and hot-cross-buns were spotted on Boxing Day!

Twelve days after Christmas we celebrate the beginning of the sub-season of Epiphany, which starts with the visitation of the wise men (magi, kings) to the infant Jesus – quite probably when he was 3 or 4 years old. Epiphany means manifestation or revelation – and celebrates a season where the reality and identity of the person of Jesus Christ was being made known.

This year the Epiphany season contains the visit of the wise men which marks the recognition by the gentile revelation John the Baptist points people to the Messiah they were expecting and baptises him, Jesus starts to preach identifying his mission from God to his own people, and at the Presentation in the Temple Jesus is identified, through Anna and Simeon, as the long expected messiah 'the consolation

of his people', reflects Isaiah's promise that he was the 'glory of Israel', and 'a light for revelation to the gentiles'.

It is worth dwelling in Epiphany and not just rushing past to the next season – take time deepening our understanding of the incarnated Jesus Messiah, enriching our discipleship in following him and preparing our hearts to kneel and worship at his feet.

And then:

‘When the song of the angels is stilled
when the star in the sky is gone
when the kings and princes are home
when the shepherds are back with their flocks
the work of Christmas begins:
to find the lost
to heal the broken
to feed the hungry
to release the prisoner
to rebuild the nations
to bring peace among people
to make music in the heart.’ *

May we listen, follow, and bow the knee with greater intent, as we enter the joy and journey of this new year, as we deepen the awareness our Lord and Saviour who has made his dwelling within us - Emmanuel.

CURATES' CORNER

HOLY MOMENTS, SLIPPERY BABIES, AND VILLAGE LIFE

As my year of curacy in rural ministry draws to a close, I realise it has been a year in which I have learned many things – chiefly that God is faithful, village life is glorious, and satin baby outfits should come with a warning label.

It has been a huge privilege to share in the holy moments of our villages. I celebrated my first two baby baptisms this year; one baby, dressed head-to-toe in beautifully shiny satin, achieved the texture and manoeuvrability of a well-buttered bar of soap. I am pleased to report that the baby was successfully returned to Mum without injury.

Alongside this have been the quieter, sacred moments: walking with families through funerals, and offering God's presence in times of both joy and sorrow – often with the kettle on. I have loved being part of our primary school and joining village life in all its forms, including face painting at the summer fete and the Christmas fair. One toddler found the experience so relaxing that she fell asleep halfway through having her face painted. I took this as either a great success or a sign I should consider a new ministry in children's meditation.

Our pet services have been a particular highlight. We have welcomed alpacas into church (who behaved impeccably), a dragon (who did not breathe fire, for which the PCC were grateful), and of course the church's long-standing resident spiders and silverfish. All were equally included as we celebrated God's love for all creation – furry, feathered, scaly, and occasionally slightly a-lam'ing.

This year has also been a time of prayerful discernment, leading to a call to become an oblate of a convent in Oxford – a reminder that God continues to work quietly, faithfully and sometimes sneakily among us.

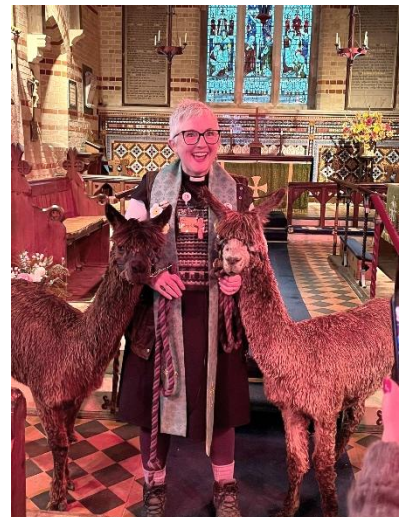
Across the parishes I have taken part in what clergy cheerfully refer to as "hatch, match, and dispatch". Having now managed both the hatch and the dispatch, I am very much looking forward to celebrating the match next year, ideally with less opportunity for things to wriggle unexpectedly.

There has been talk nationally of a "quiet revival", and it can be tempting to think that such things happen somewhere else entirely. Yet when three extra people join a congregation of around ten, that's nearly a 30% increase – which, statistically speaking, is nothing short of miraculous. God is clearly at work among us, often gently, often unnoticed, but with a very good sense of humour.



I feel deeply blessed to walk alongside you all and I am immensely thankful for the warmth, welcome, laughter, and shared life of our villages. It has been a joy – and only occasionally a health and safety concern. Blessings, soap and grace to you

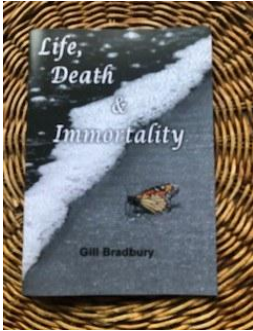
