ROMANS IN THE NEW TESTAMENT- PORCIUS FESTUS

Porcius Festus was the Governor of Judea from AD 60 to AD 62. He appears to have died in office. Unlike the corrupt Felix, Festus was an honest man with no understanding of spiritual matters but anxious to forge a better relationship with the Jews. He was really a blunt, rough soldier. Impressed by Paul, he treated him fairly.

Paul, frustrated by his continual imprisonment, appealed to Caesar invoking his right as a Roman citizen. Festus was bound to send him to Rome, but he had no idea on what charge. Consulting the last of the Herods, Herod Agrippa 11, King only in name of the small principality of Chalcis, they jointly examine Paul. Festus has such little understanding of the issues that at one point in exasperation he tells Paul he is mad, caused by too much learning! At the end of the proceedings Festus and Agrippa declare Paul innocent of any charge, but they are forced to send him to Rome.

Again, Festus shows many of the best qualities in Roman officers that we find in the New Testament - an honest decent man with no concept of God.
