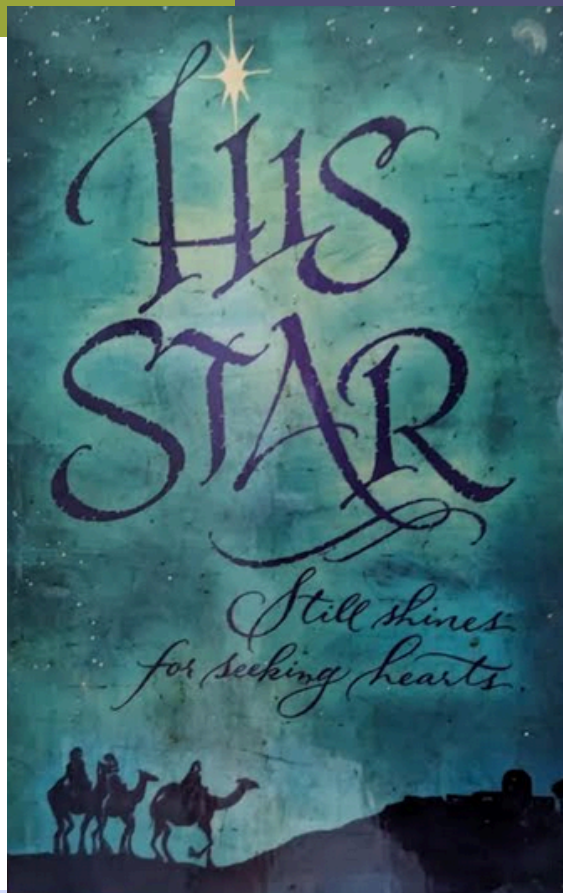

REFLECTIONS.....MARIAN IVENS

Star of Wonder

Stars are wonderful, but to this day, this star, "His Star" was, and is, unique - never been replicated. Here are a few facts.

The primary Old Testament prophecy cited in connection with the Star is from the Book of Numbers, v.17: **"A star will come out of Jacob; a sceptre will rise out of Israel."**

This passage is widely recognised as a prediction of the Messiah. It is likely that followers of the prophet Daniel- who was exiled to Babylon in Persia/Iran during the Jewish captivity, and appointed the chief of the magi, (astrologers and diviners)- knew the Jewish scriptures and were actively waiting for a sign related to this prophecy. God is not above using the night skies to herald His activities. These astronomers noticed very unusual happenings around the planet Jupiter and the largest star Regulus (cf Revelation 12 v. 1-5) It seemed there was something in the air, a growing awareness in the human spirit that something was afoot.

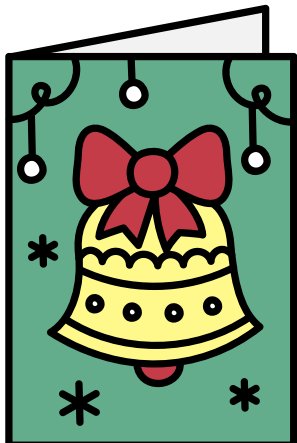
