THEOLOGY DISCUSSION GROUP



The PCC met this week and here is a flavour of what was discussed.

Next steps for the toilet extension at St Bridget's which is now ready for planning application. The continued challenge that our regular income

does not meet our regular expenditure. Development of Caldy church and hall. News on the return of the organ at St Bridget's but the need for work on the organ at Caldy. Charitable giving. A proposal for both churches to be come 'Pilgrim Places'. The use of Prayers of Love and Faith following the marriage of same-sex couples. The need for volunteers to keep the West Kirby Museum open. Our spending forecast – what we want to do and when we might do it. Our 'church life priorities 'tree' -have we got any gaps and how are we fulfilling our mission? The safeguarding policies and action plan. We reflected on reports received from teams looking after finance pastoral care, buildings, children and young people, study, nurture, worship and prayer, social action, inclusive and eco church, publicity and outreach, St Bridget's Centre and the churchyard teams. Never believe anyone who says that PCC is dull. We will be electing new members to PCC at our Annual Parochial Church Meeting in May: perhaps you would like to be involved?
