For several years now, Anglicans in the Winterbournes (but *everyone* is welcome...) have joined our sisters and brothers in **Bourne Valley Methodist Church** for their annual **Covenant Service** which offers a deeply meaningful and inspiring 'recommitment' to God at the start of each year. Accordingly, there will be no Anglican Services in the two Winterbourne Parishes on Sunday 18th January, as we worship together, and enjoy fellowship in Winterbourne Dauntsey...

Each year, from 18th to 25th January, the **Week of Prayer for Christian Unity** is held, seeking to follow the desire expressed by Jesus in John 17: 20 – 23 that all Christians should be one, united in faith, hope and love. But unity does not necessarily mean *uniformity* - the distinctive aspects of our created nature reveal God's glory, and diversity is to be embraced, not feared. This year let us pray for greater understanding, harmony, respect and tolerance of those whose understanding, views and practices may differ from ours, yet whose sincere seeking after truth is just as valid as our own.

Please continue to pray for our local **Schools** as the cold weather brings its own additional challenge. Please pray for safety and protection on School journeys, and that staff, pupils and families would be able to stay healthy, enabling everyone to flourish, and learn well.

As tensions around the world remain high, please remember the weekly **Peace Vigils** held at **5.00pm** on **Saturdays** in Salisbury, in the Cheese Market area outside the library, at the edge of the market square. There is no speech-making, no shouting, no sloganeering – just people standing together in silence, bearing witness to the catastrophe in the Middle East, and yearning for justice and peace for the region.
