Call to Worship

Please remain seated as Rev'd Jenni Crewes greets us;

One: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Many: Amen.

One: Christ has brought us out of hopelessness

Many: To live in God's wonderful light.

One: Christ has brought us to new life

Many: To live in God's glorious hope.

Welcome

We remain seated as we receive words of welcome and introduction.

One: Dear Friends,
God is love, God gives us life.
We love because God first loves us.
In baptism God declares that love;
In Christ God calls us to respond.

We rejoice today as a family as we thank you, O God
for the gift of your love and remember our baptisms.

Water is poured into the font to remind us of baptism;

So let us pray: We praise you, loving Creator, for the
gift of Jesus. He was baptized in the River Jordan,
where your Spirit came upon him and revealed him as
the Son you love.

He sent his followers to baptize all who turn to him.
Now, life-giving God,

we ask you to bless this water,
that through it we may be cleansed in the water of
life, and, filled with your Spirit,
and reminded that we are loved as your children, safe
in Christ for ever.

We listen or join in with the song while we are invited to splash ourselves with water from the font, or mark our foreheads with the water as a symbol of God's forgiveness.

NEW FOR 2026 - BREATHING SPACE

“Breathing Space” is a new monthly gathering for contemplative, silent prayer. This is an ancient Christian practice of being attentive to the presence of a loving God within us and around us, and offers us a time of stillness and peace in our noisy and distracted world. Each gathering will begin with a short introductory reading leading into 20mins silent prayer, following our breath or reciting a prayer word to still our minds. We end with 5 – 10 mins of conversation about the practice.

Breathing Space will take place on the 3rd Friday of each month: 16th Jan, 20th Feb, 20th March, at 10 - 10.45am in the vestry. Please enter the church through the back door in the car park.

It is open to all who are seeking peace and who long for connection with God and community.

WOMEN'S THEOLOGY

Mother Diane our curate and Mother Charlotte Gibson, who works for the diocese of Birmingham, run a Women's Theology Group fortnightly during term times. We meet on Thursday evening at St George's vicarage Edgbaston and on Friday morning at Evoke Cafe on Harborne High St. It's open to anyone who identifies as a woman and is 18 years of age and over. It's ecumenical, which means people come from a variety of churches in the local area. No preparation is necessary and it's suitable for all levels of knowledge and ability. Each week is a separate session so you can come as and when you like. We look at women's stories in the Bible and see how God shows the good news of themselves to the women and ourselves. If anyone is interested in coming along, speak to Mother Diane and she can give you more details. The next dates are 22nd and 23rd January, and 5th and 6th February.

January Eco Tips - RSPB's Big Garden Birdwatch

The RSPB's Big Garden Birdwatch (Friday 23-Sunday 25 January) is the world's largest garden wildlife survey! We've lost a staggering 38 million birds from UK skies in the last 60 years. With birds facing so many challenges, it's more important than ever to get involved in the Birdwatch. To take part, spend one hour counting the birds you see in one location and submit your findings to the RSPB. This could be in your garden, balcony, local park or join us after the service on Sunday 25

VOLUNTEER NEEDED: PARISH SAFEGUARDING COORDINATOR (PSC)

After over a decade in this role Anne Harris intends to step down at the next APCM. We are seeking to recruit in time for a smooth handover from Anne and for the next PSC to work alongside Mike Baynham as part of a team.

This role is; to work with the incumbent and PCC in promoting safeguarding within the parish, and to ensure that church leaders are implementing the Church of England's safeguarding guidance. The Parish Safeguarding Coordinator is the key link person between the parish and the Diocesan Safeguarding Team.

This role requires an enhanced DBS and completion of several training modules offered by the Diocese. Good computer literacy is essential for this as it includes working with a database.
