CHRISTMAS IN THE PARISH

For those of you who were away over Christmas, or who were unable to get to any of the services through ill health, we thought you might like a short report.



19th December Caldy Carols on the green outside church after dark, followed by mince pies and mulled wine in church. There is a video on Facebook (search for West Kirby and Caldy church carols): this was a great success with about 50 people joining together.

21st December The traditional service of carols and readings in St Bridget's. The junior and adult choirs sang beautifully and some of the children were brave enough to sing solos. The church was full and there was a lovely atmosphere, from the beginning of the service, with the church in darkness, to the resounding ending.

Christmas Eve The outdoor/indoor nativity, when visitors tried to find rooms at one of the inns in Bethlehem. On the way, they were challenged by the bearded and heavily disguised tax collectors, encouraged by the night watchman by his fire and patrolled by the Bethlehem Police Dog Unit. Once in church, 'the room in the inn', a great cast told the story with much conviction to the 400 visitors, even down to the (real) baby in the manger (the baby's brother wasn't keen on this idea!)

Midnight Mass was very well attended this year with about 190 people present. Rev. Alex said that she had never blessed so many at the altar rail – wonderful that these visitors (many younger people) felt able to do this during Communion, instead of staying in their pews looking uncomfortable.



At St Bridget's, following the quiet communion at 8am on **Christmas morning**, we welcomed about 160 to the 10am service. Many of our usual members were absent as they were away or not well enough to attend, so it was heartening to see lots of visitors and children, who were able to watch the opening of the big, wrapped box during Rev. Alex's talk (spoiler alert! A gold, helium-filled star floated out). The Caldy service was also well attended.
