The Rector writes ...



Happy new year to all readers of this newsletter – which includes our regular congregation and those who read the newsletter in England or further afield.

We start 2026 with the feast of the Epiphany, transferred from 6 January to the nearest Sunday so that the maximum number of people are able to share in this important feast day.

The first picture is a familiar image, like many which we have seen on Christmas cards.

The second picture is different. It's of a delicate stone carving, which shows the wise men asleep under a delicately embroidered blanket, after they have met the Holy Family and presented their gifts. They had encountered Herod on their stop in Jerusalem. As Herod's paranoid jealousy was not yet apparent, they took at face value Herod's request that they bring him word of where Jesus is to be found 'so that I may also go and pay him homage.'

But this was not to be. Instead, we read that 'having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, [the wise men] left for their own country by another road.'

The carving depicts how this came to pass. The angel delicately touches the fingers of one of the wise men, to give them the warning about the necessary change of plan.

Epiphany is the season which unfolds how Jesus' unique identity became known and how his ministry unfolded. The manger scene remains in place throughout the season of Epiphany, until Candlemas, the feast of the presentation of Jesus in the Temple, which marks the end of the sequence of the Church's year which began with Advent.

However, our Christmas tree will be removed during the coming week. To assist in the removal of the tree, Sharon Harvey asks for assistance in removing the baubles and decorations after the 10 am service on Sunday.

Readings

Old Testament reading: the prophecy of Isaiah chapter 60 verses 1-6

Arise, shine; for your light has come,
and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you.

For darkness shall cover the earth,
and thick darkness the peoples;
but the Lord will arise upon you,
and his glory will appear over you.

Nations shall come to your light,

Gospel: Matthew 2 verses 1-12

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, ‘Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage.’ When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, ‘In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

“And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,
are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;
for from you shall come a ruler
who is to shepherd my people Israel.” ’

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, ‘Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage.’ When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure-chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

discern the glory of your presence in your Son,
