Letters from our Vicar, Rector and Rural Dean – and from our Curate

The Churches were very well attended over Christmas and I hope people will come to Church on other days in 2026! Many visitors commented on our villages being welcoming. Thank you for being part of the Christmas Celebrations in our communities.

As we move into February, we find ourselves at a turning point in the church calendar, closing the season of Epiphany and looking forward to the journey of Lent. This month often brings a unique mix of themes, from the lingering need for light in the winter darkness to the approaching thoughtfulness and inner reflection of the Lenten season.

The feast day of Candlemas (2nd February, the 40th Day of Christmas) marks the presentation of Jesus at the Temple by Joseph and Mary, based on the account in Luke 2:22–40. Many Christians take their candles to their church, to be blessed and then used for the rest of the year, a reminder that Jesus is the light that shines in the darkness, a hope we all need in difficult times, whether facing illness, bereavement, or financial worries. This light is a sign of God's constant presence and hope, even in our darkest moments.

This year, Lent starts quite early (Ash Wednesday, 18th February) so you can prepare for Easter (5th April). As Lent begins, it offers us an annual "second chance", to prepare our hearts and minds for Easter. It is a time focusing on prayer, generosity, and humbler faith. Our shared journey through Lent, perhaps with a specific study course, helps us to arrive at Easter refreshed and energised by the hope of the Resurrection.

Many of us may have watched the poignant film, 'The Way', where a father, coming to terms with the loss and death of his son whilst on the Camino de Santiago, tries to trace his son's steps with hopes of drawing closer to him. The father faces moments of change at each encounter with others, realising the hardship of being on The Way, and yet somehow finding hope within each person's story that he listens to and joins in with. The encounters are transitory and yet meaningful, as we too join in with the stories and are ourselves taken on a pilgrimage. There are moments of quiet loneliness, yet the father discovers grace, acceptance and forgiveness, and comes to understand his son's heart better as a result. In each of our lives, and in each of our ways, we too need to find love, hope and enough grace for each moment, and acceptance of what has been and what lies ahead of us on our own pilgrimages.
