### Year 6 School Leavers Transition Workshops

I will be holding special year 6 school transition sessions in our two church schools this term.

The workshop is titled 'Building on Solid Ground' and is loosely based around the parable of the wise and foolish builders. The main focus of the sessions will be identifying the children's aspirations and dreams for the future and discussing the best foundations on which to build them on.

We will be creating an art piece which includes painting rocks and creating aspirational 'leaves' for tree branches. A tree within the school grounds will be nominated for use as a focal point and each child will place their painted rock at the root (foundation) and carefully hang decorated handmade leaves containing their dreams and aspirations to the branches.

I look forward to seeing where God leads this new initiative.

### Happy birthday to the Nicene Creed! 1700 years old this year.

Across churches around the world there is common agreement that the fullest statement about God was made in two stages and summarised in the words of the Nicene creed. Hundreds of bishops, many with differing views, met in Nicea, current day Iznik in Turkey. After much discussion they agreed a form of words to describe how they would describe God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit and it was recited every Sunday in their churches.

We have a chance to study it and relate it to today's world in a six week course at All Saints church, in the Fryatt room. There is a free booklet to go with the course. The course begins at 7pm on Wednesday June 11<sup>th</sup>, then 18<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>, July 2<sup>nd</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>.
