

This Sunday we are delighted to welcome Annette Walker, who begins her new role with us as Musical Director and Organist.


A very warm welcome to Annette from us all at St. Leonard's

Small card, big prayer

Over the last couple of weeks, you may have received a small card at the start of a Sunday service. It contains the Leading Your Church into Growth prayer – a simple reminder that the future of our church is not built on



plans alone, but on prayer.

Please can I encourage you to place the card somewhere obvious: on the fridge door, beside your bed, tucked into a diary, or near the kettle. Mine is on the cupboard door next to the kettle, so I see it several times a day. It's a gentle nudge – a visual reminder that even the smallest prayer matters.

There's no need to set aside a long stretch of time. If life is busy, simply pray one line at a time as you notice it. A single sentence offered sincerely is never wasted. Prayer does not need to be lengthy to be meaningful.

As we continue to take part in the Leading Your Church into Growth journey, it's important to remember that real growth – the kind that deepens faith, strengthens community, and draws people closer to Christ – comes not through effort alone, but through God's strength and our willingness to pray.

The full prayer once a day, or a single line while the kettle boils, each small moment adds up. Together, they become a shared rhythm of hope and trust, placing our church's future where it has always belonged – with God.
