Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

**AFTER MASS TODAY WE HAVE OUR BRING AND SHARE LUNCH IN THE HALL. IF YOU HAVE BROUGHT FOOD WITH YOU TO SHARE, PLEASE TAKE IT TO THE HALL BEFORE MASS BEGINS.**

St Matthew's recounting of the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist contains two important details, not included in the baptism narratives of the other gospels, which help us to understand the great significance of the event. This first of these is John's reticence to baptise Jesus at all. "I need to be



baptised by you, and do you come to me?" And the second is Jesus's rather strange response, "Let it be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfil all righteousness." John is saying that he is far less important than Jesus, and that his baptism, a baptism for repentance,

cannot be compared with the baptism that Jesus will offer which will be a baptism "with the Holy Spirit and fire" as John himself says in the previous chapter of Matthew's gospel. So, the reticence of John to baptise Jesus is in reality a reticence about offering a baptism of repentance to a man who is 'without sin'. But Jesus's response seems to be saying that this isn't a problem. Even if it *looks* (let it be so now) as if John is cleansing Jesus from sin and thus making him righteous, which of course he already is as the Son of God, the deeper reality is different.
