Rev Canon Julie is retiring on Sunday 26th April.

Dear Friends,

This year I will have been in full time ministry for 25 years both lay and ordained. I have been with you in the parishes for over 12 years and I have loved being your parish priest - your rector, and I hope you will feel we have grown and journeyed together in our worship and spiritual growth, becoming a Church family. Over the years our building projects have enabled us to grow our mission and vision in our parishes and it has been a privilege to serve you.

Trevor and I have been thinking and praying for a couple of years about the next stage of our lives. After nearly two years of praying and in discussion with the Bishop, we feel the time has come for me to step back from full time ministry. To have a sabbatical for a while before finding out what next for us and for our family.

This has been a very hard decision to make as after twelve years this Rector has grown to love our church family. It is never easy to leave but the Lord has provided a good team across the benefice and I know He has plans for our future and your future. It will be a time to work together.

Fortunately, the growth of a church isn't just down to the Rector, the church is all of us, praying and serving together. I really want to thank all of you for the many ways you have blessed me over the years.

I am sorry if this comes as a shock to some of you.

During our time here, our own children have married and given us five Grandchildren. We have walked through a pandemic and seen incredible provision to help our churches grow and flourish. Honestly, there is so much to be thankful for. I also know all of you will step up in new ways, working together with those who will support the parishes in prayer.

I want you all to know that the next few months will not change the way I care about each parish. There will be lots to say and do in the coming weeks. I have already begun the process and will make sure we leave with some strong foundations. I also hope our time together will be full of thankfulness and celebration.

When we move, at the end of April, the parish will enter what is called an interregnum. In the interregnum there will be a need for everyone – the whole body of Christ here – to play your part and in praying and preparing for the person that God will call to minister here in the future. It takes time and all our church wardens along with the Archdeacon will work together. We are blessed with a strong team but they will need your support and prayers.

At our three churches PCC meeting on Monday evening, I used the words from 1 Thessalonians 1 where Paul reminds the church of the work of faith, the labour of love and the steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. Faith and example lived out together.

Please don't underestimate the emotion I feel about this decision. There will be lots more to say in the coming weeks. Come and talk to me. I am still here! If you have any questions, please do talk to me or one of the **churchwardens**. My last weekend with you all will be the 25th and 26th April.

Hope Explored



For peace and justice in our world, for all caught up in war and conflict, and for peacemakers. For Israel and Gaza, that the fragile peace will hold, and that as the “Board of Peace” is established, that a way forward with the 2nd stage of the peace plan will commence. For Ukraine, that following recent discussions there will be renewed efforts to compel Russia to enter peace negotiations with real intent, so that a just and lasting peace acceptable to Ukraine may be negotiated.

For Greenland, that the troubling US Government rhetoric will cease, and that negotiations between the US and NATO to address security concerns will hear and respect, the will of the Greenlandic people, and the Kingdom of Denmark.
