## A word from Andrew

We are currently in the season of Epiphany, a series of epiphany moments, where suddenly we get it, the truth is revealed – perhaps it's a realization of something, and we say to ourselves, 'Why didn't I see that before?' – perhaps it's more a revelation, something we could otherwise have had no way of knowing, but someone or something revealed it to us. Perhaps it happens in an encounter with God, a special spiritual moment...

Revelations from God are something we should be seeking throughout the year, not just in that part of the Church's year called 'Epiphany'. Words from God are our food - 'Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God' Matthew 4:4. 'Blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked... but his delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law he meditates day and night' Psalm 1:1 - 2. As we allow God space and meditate on his word, those epiphany moments come as he speaks to us and we experience his attention given to us.
