LENT

Lent is a forty-day season of reflection, repentance, prayer, and generosity, preparing Christians to follow Jesus closely and celebrate Easter with renewed faith, hope, humility, and love and joy together

When Moses asks God for his name, the answer he receives is mysterious and powerful: **"I am."** Not a description, not a label, but a living presence. God simply is — faithful, active, and close.

So if God is "I am," what does that make you?

Lent invites us to sit with that question. In the Gospels, Jesus echoes those same words again and again: "I am the bread of life." "I am the light of the world." "I am the way." In Jesus, we discover not only who God is, but who we are called to be — people shaped by love, truth, service, and hope.

This year our Lent course will explore who Jesus is and what that means for who we are. Not as an abstract idea, but as a lived reality: how faith shapes our choices, our relationships, and our sense of purpose.

You don't need all the answers to begin — just a willingness to ask the questions. Come and explore with us what it means to live faithfully as people who can say, with humility and trust, "Here I am."

This year's Course will run for 5 weeks starting on the evening of Tuesday 24th February at the Vicarage. There will also be a session on Wednesday evenings at the home of John and Gina Larkin and I am happy to lead a daytime course if there is sufficient demand. Please let John and Gina, or myself know if you are planning to attend.

Prayers for the world:

we continue to pray for an easing of political tensions and for peace and stability to be restored wherever there is unease and conflict in our world. We pray for those enduring the devastation caused by adverse climate conditions, urging the nations to work together to mitigate the effects of global warming. We pray for all suffering the hardships of hunger, cold, lack of shelter and medical facilities and we ask your blessing on all agencies working to support them.

Prayers for the nation:

we pray for King Charles and all the members of the royal family in their devoted service to the people of this country and the Commonwealth. We pray for our country's leaders and its government to focus on the welfare and best interests of the nation, especially the vulnerable, disadvantaged and needy, amid rising prices and slow economic growth. We pray especially for all NHS workers at this critical time of year, that you would give them the strength to continue working in the face of increasing pressure on their services.

Prayers for the Church:

we pray for the Church and its leaders and the deliberations at General Synod in London this month. We pray for our Deanery of Coleshill & Polesworth and the Synod meeting on 4th February, that its discussions will be productive. Especially we ask your blessing on our Parish of All Souls, on Joanne, Barry and family, on the churchwardens, PCC members and all our Church family as we work towards moving forward in the year ahead.

we pray for all those who reside or work in the villages in our parish, that you would continue to bless, guide and protect them. SERVICE OF CELEBRATION:

CHURCH FINANCES :

As our finances begin to show some signs of recovery, the All Souls PCC has committed to paying £30,000 to the Diocese as its share of Common Fund for the year 2026, although this by no means meets the full cost of having a vicar in post. Your continued support and ongoing generosity is therefore deeply appreciated.

As we await updates on the funding needed for roof repairs at Austrey, Warton and Newton Regis, along with redecoration at Shuttington and Warton, fundraising continues apace.
