

The First Reading: Isaiah 60: 1-6

Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD has risen upon you. For darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the LORD will arise upon you, and his glory will appear over you. Nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn. Lift up your eyes and look around; they all gather together, they come to you; your sons shall come from far away, and your daughters shall be carried on their nurses' arms. Then you shall see and be radiant; your heart shall thrill and rejoice, because the abundance of the sea shall be brought to you, the wealth of the nations shall come to you. A multitude of camels shall cover you, the young camels of Midian and Ephah; all those from Sheba shall come. They shall bring gold and frankincense and shall proclaim the praise of the LORD.

The Second Reading: Matthew 2: 1-12

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, 'Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising and have come to pay him homage.' When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, 'In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: "And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people, Israel."'

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, 'Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage.' When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy.

On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure-chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

Reflection from Alison

A very **happy New Year** to you all. As we step into 2026, we do so in the season of Epiphany, a season about *revelation*, about God being made known not in grand gestures, but through quiet signs that draw us gently towards hope.

A star in the sky. A child in a manger. Ordinary things that become holy because God chooses to meet us there.

Over these past weeks, something beautiful has been revealed across our benefice of **Harden, Wilsden, Cullingworth and Denholme**. Our Christingle and Carol services were wonderfully well attended, our churches filled with light, music, generosity and warmth. It was a reminder that people are still drawn by the light, even when faith feels tentative, or life feels complicated.

At **St John's**, some people placed robins on the Christmas tree in memory of loved ones. Small, tender acts of remembrance that spoke of love that continues beyond loss, and of hope held gently alongside grief. And scattered throughout our villages were the baby Jesus stones, simple, unexpected signs left in everyday places, quietly proclaiming that God is with us, in our streets and homes, even when the way ahead feels uncertain.

The wise men did not have a map, only a star. They trusted the light enough to follow it. And so we find ourselves at the beginning of a new year, standing on the threshold of a new chapter. We give thanks for all that has been, and we hold before God our hope that this year will bring the arrival of a new Team Rector, someone called and gifted to walk with us, to guide us, and to help us discern where the light is leading next. As we look ahead, we pray that **2026 will be a year of blessing** across our benefice, a year of kindness, healing and renewed hope. And we especially pray for those who begin this year carrying heavy burdens: those facing illness, loss, anxiety or uncertainty. May no one feel alone. May all know themselves supported, held in prayer, and surrounded by the quiet faithfulness of this community.

Epiphany reminds us of this enduring truth: God has already gone ahead of us. The light still shines. And as we keep our eyes open, and our hearts willing, we will recognise Christ among us, and be changed by what we find.
