## Reflection for Epiphany

### The Unsearchable Riches of Christ

*"Someone's knocking at your door!"* The repetitive jingle of the Post Code Lottery adds! There was no post-code lottery about three excited men bubbling over with joy knocking at Mary and Joseph's door. For Mary and Joseph, surprise and bewilderment, as these foreign nationals entered, fell prostrate before the Lord Jesus and offered him their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

Here is the "mystery" referred to by Paul in the epistle for Epiphany (which we celebrate on Tuesday) unfolding more clearly on two counts. First, Christ, the Light of the world, has come to be Saviour of all, who like the Magi, fall prostrate before him in worship, adoration and surrender to him as Lord and King. The Gospel is for all nations and ethnicities.

*"Worthy are you .... for you were slain, and by your blood you ransomed people for God from every tribe and language and people and nation," Revelation 5:9.* It is the Gospel that bridges divides. Second, a central purpose for the Church, *"that through the church the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places."* Paul, writing to the church in Corinth was specific about this wisdom. It is, *"Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God."* 1 Corinthians 1:24. A wisdom that found its expression in The Servant of God, crucified, risen, reigning and returning, our Saviour, Jesus Christ our Lord.

The Wisemen came and surrendered before a young child, the One who is *"the wisdom of God"*. As another year unfolds, they serve as a reminder of the limitations of human wisdom. How we need humbly to seek his wisdom day by day, and to pray for our world leaders to humble themselves and seek the Lord's wisdom for the problems and challenges that defy human wisdom. The Wisemen came offering their costly gifts and laid them before Christ. Yet Paul writes of *"the unsearchable riches of Christ."* Riches of love, mercy, grace, forgiveness, hope, joy, peace, wisdom, authority, power and above all glory and holiness that find their outworking in our everyday lives and fulfilled in the life to come. Riches money cannot buy, given through the grace of God working in us by the Holy Spirit. It is Christ knocking at our door to us these *"unsearchable riches"*.

May we come in worship, adoration, fresh surrender of our lives and renewed trust in Jesus, the Light of the world, King of kings and Lord of lords.

All-powerful Father,  
you have made known the birth of  
the Saviour by the light of a star,  
May he continue to guide us with his light,  
Enlighten us with his radiance,  
And strengthen us with his care,  
Until with joy,  
He takes us to our eternal home.
